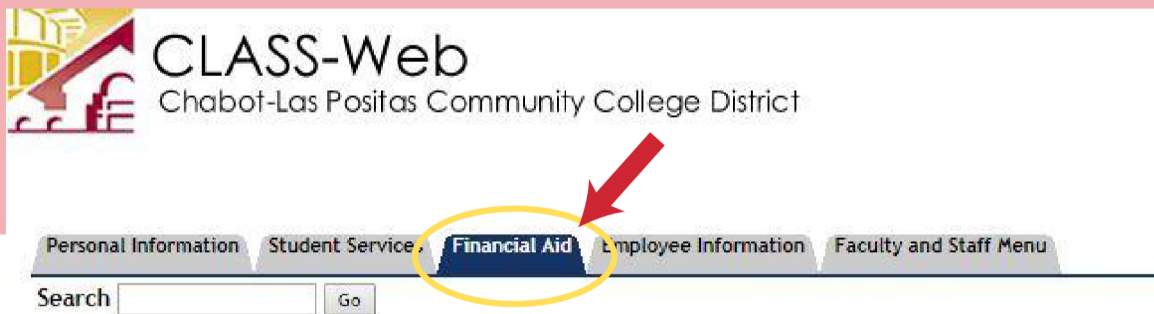


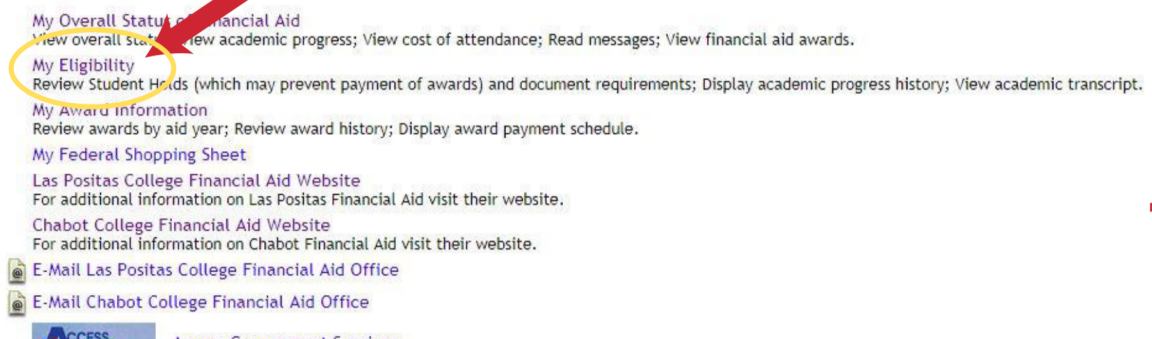
How to Check Your Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) Status

Students who have applied for financial aid will see their Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) status under the "Financial Aid" tab on CLASS-Web.

Step 1: Log-in to CLASS-Web and select the "Financial Aid" tab



Step 2: Select "My Eligibility"
