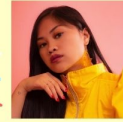

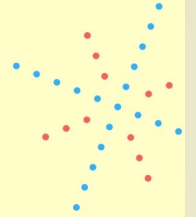
Our 1st event was a watch party. We watched a video, "The Model Minority Trope," and discussed with attendees how AAPIs are depicted and viewed in pop culture. Over 30 people attended the event.

Here's a perspective from an attendee:

"I think it's important to address the intergenerational experience, including trauma associated with AAPI stereotypes and hate crimes, especially when considering immigrant families (1st, 2nd, 3rd generation etc.) I feel like that is lacking as part of many conversations. I also think that there are so many problems with visibility and a deeper understanding of the diverse cultures encompassed within the AAPI community - I'm white, and I don't think the majority of my white friends and family members really have any depth of understanding in that realm."

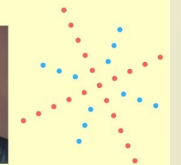

Our 2nd event during the Spring 2021 semester was a conversation with LPC AAPI students. Students spoke of the diversity within the AAPI community and historical discrimination of AAPIs in the U.S. They also shared their concerns about the growing anti-Asian hate crimes since the Trump administration and mental health challenges faced by AAPIs.

Here are some comments from attendees:

“Because as an Asian student, I really value the opinions of my community's peers. I wanted to have a conversation with them and hopefully personally connect with them.”

“I want to be an ally and support Asian students at LPC.”

“I think addressing mental health in the Asian community would be an important topic to cover. Mental health is heavily stigmatized but should be addressed.”

Fall 2021

Our 3rd event was an AAPI Jeopardy game and Q & A with LPC Students.

Attendees actively participated in a Jeopardy game that tested their knowledge of AAPI cultures and histories.

LPC sophomore and junior students also spoke about their campus experiences.

Some of the topics they discussed were:

- Campus resources that are/were critical to student success
- How to join a club
- Where to gain leadership experience
- How to have a successful first semester/year at LPC
- Self-care strategies
- How to balance school/work/personal life

Our 4th event during the Fall 2021 semester was conversation with LPC & Chabot Afghan Students and special guest Mallory De Lauro, District Chief of Staff & Foreign Affairs Advisor to Congressman Eric Swalwell (CA-15). We had 45 attendees.

Students spoke about their Afghan heritage, family histories, and college experiences. The students and Ms. De Lauro also shared their feelings about the past and present humanitarian crises in Afghanistan, and the Afghan refugees who fled to the U.S. and other countries for safety and support.

Here's a testimonial from a LPC student who attended and moderated this event:

"I am in Puente, and student government, and I love learning about other cultures. I found the the AAPI Interest group events allowed me to meet students of other cultures and hear their story. I loved the panelists for the Afghan Panel, and I heard many students who attended and weren't panelists come out and share their story too which was powerful."

- Mike, Frances, and Stella come up with the name AAPI Learning Community Interest Group (shortened to AAPI Interest Group)

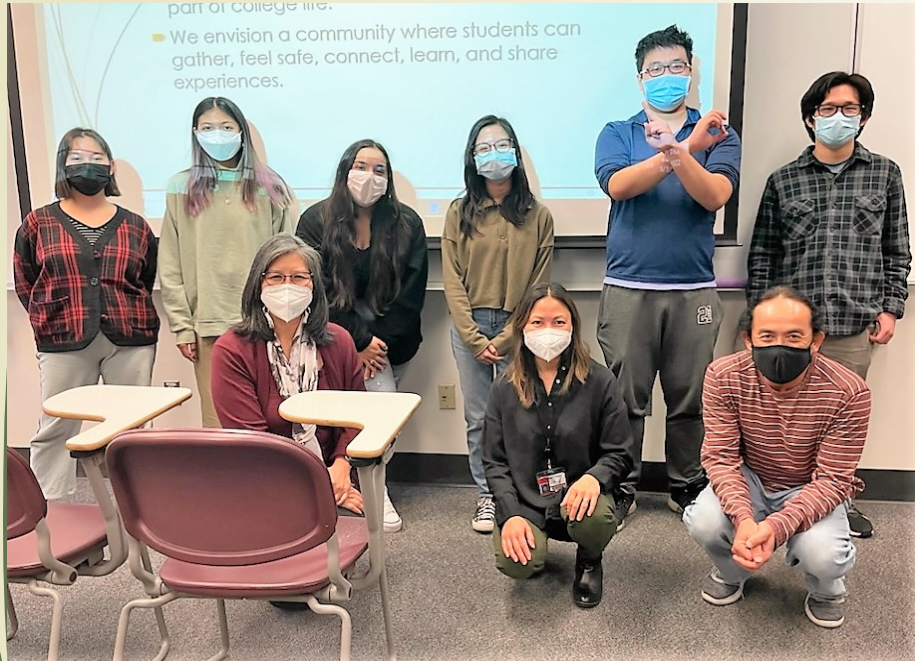
❖ Fall 2021

- Meeting with Chabot colleagues, Arnold Paguio, Director of Student Life, Michael Lai, coordinator of Change it Now and Movement Learning Communities, and Chancellor Gerhard to discuss AAPI student interests and needs
- Presentation at a Pleasanton North Rotary Foundation's board meeting as a follow up to a grant application for the AAPI Interest Group (the foundation approved our application and provided funds shortly after)

❖ Spring 2022

- Academic Senate passed Senate Resolution in Support of Translation Services (AS 4) for LPC
- Conversation with Shawn Taylor about SEA funds for LPC AAPI students (he was able to secure funds for the semester)
- Meeting with Rajinder Samra regarding data for LPC AAPI students and AAPIs in Alameda county and Tri-Valley
