Important Data to Remember



- SCFF “Hold harmless” to remain in place until 2023/2024
- 20/21 Budget Revenue is the same as our 19/20 Budget Revenue
- COLA @ 0%, Growth Funding 0%, Revenue Deferrals
- District plans to use the rollback set-aside funding
- The District intends to meet all negotiated contractual obligations
- Projected step, column and longevity increases: Added Cost = \$1.1 million

Important Data to Remember



- Projected medical benefit increases of 8%: Added Cost = \$533,000
- Negotiated raise: Added Cost \$2.04 million
- Projected STRS rate decrease from 17.10% to 16.15%: Savings = \$125,000
- Projected PERS rate increase from 19.72% to 20.70%: Added Cost = \$108,000
- If additional monies become available from the state and/or federal government, revenue assumption will change.

Record a short video of encouragement



Initiate contact with and introductory email message

Students will complete a brief questionnaire

Preferred contact info

Their “why”, major, aspirations and beliefs

Link to video (to be determined)



Call each student at least once a semester



Email each student at least once a semester



Receive contact; allow students to reach out to you

Increase Student Access to CU Coach

- One-hour ConferZoom for student drop-in questions
 - Works well for students who work full-time (i.e. evening students)
- Google Voice texting functionality
- Create a group chat (i.e. GroupMe)

Establish	Establish a non-instructional Canvas Page for ease of announcements
Connect	Connect with first-year Black students at the upcoming Resource Fair <ul style="list-style-type: none">• May require reaching out to students prior to the Resource Fair
Be Visible	Need visibility in the form of a Black Resource Page There has been expressed interest on establishing this page from a few individuals and this group
