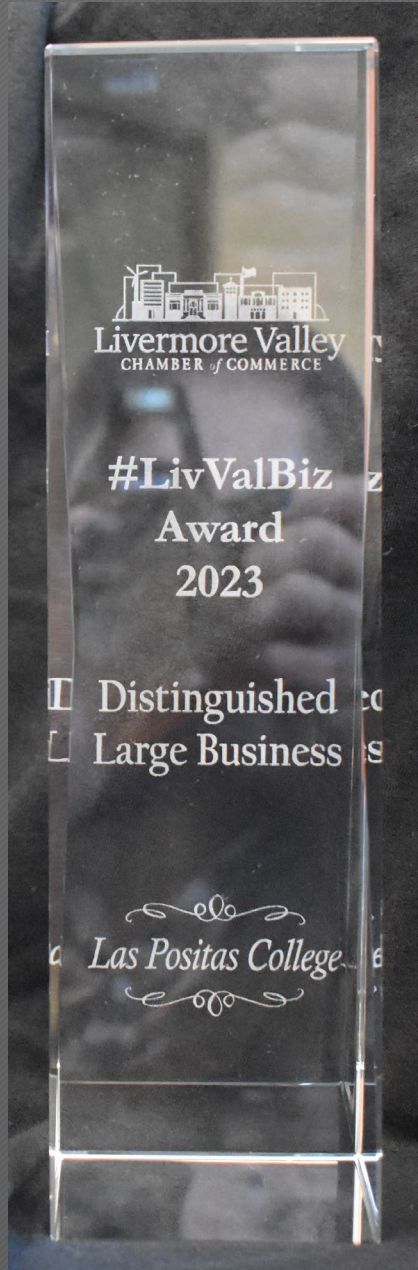

The Nobel Prize in Chemistry 2023 was awarded to Mounji Bawendi, Louis Brus and Alexei Ekimov “for the discovery and synthesis of quantum dots.”

Independently of each other, Ekimov and Brus succeeded in creating quantum dots, and Bawendi revolutionised the chemical production.

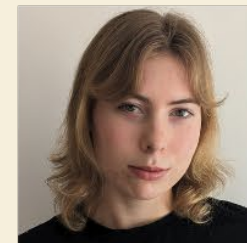

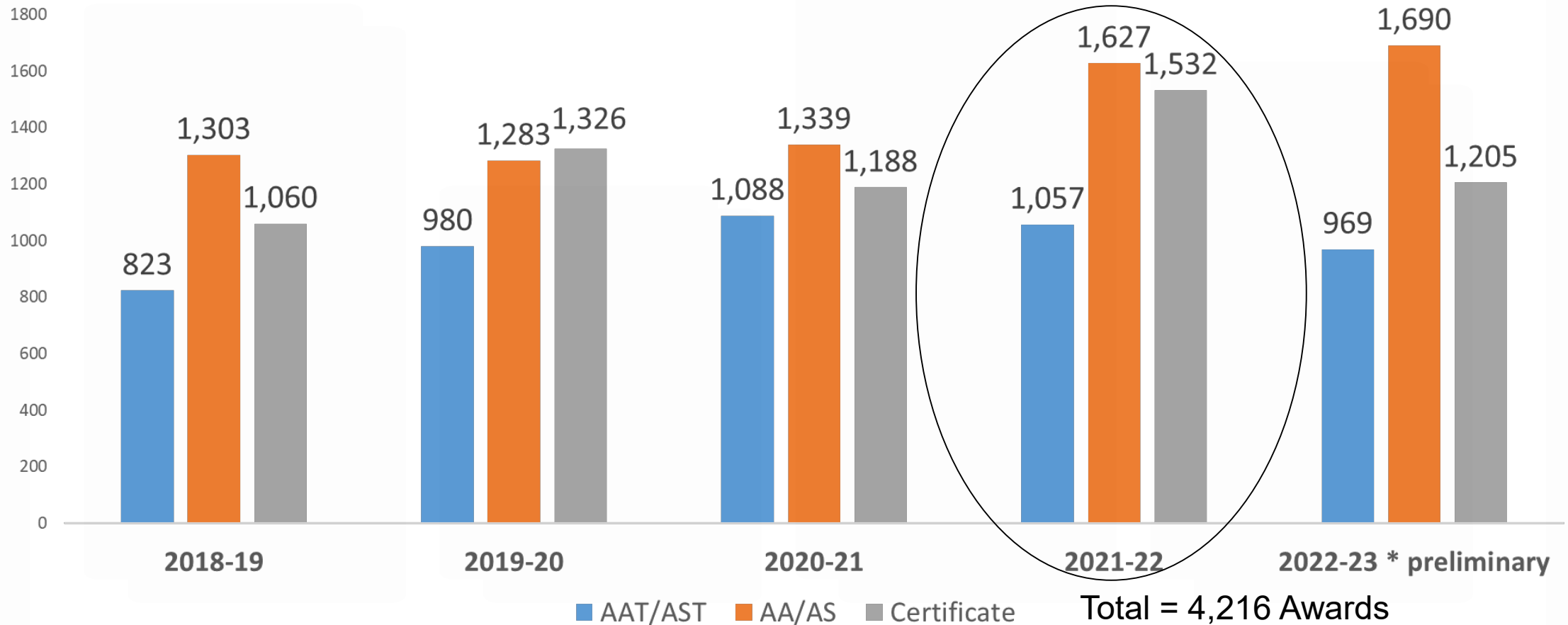

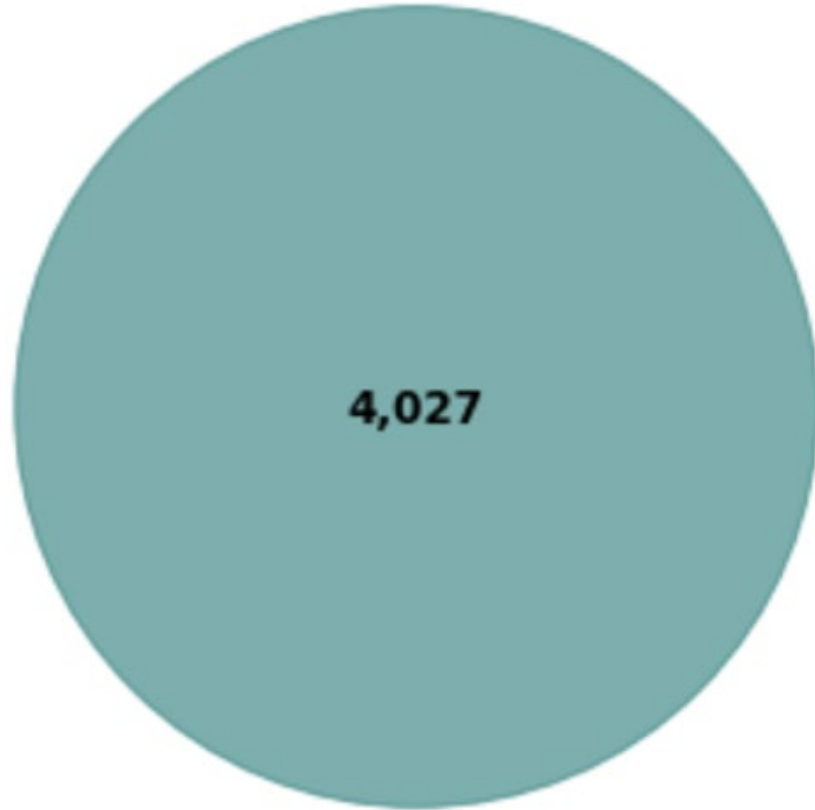
Number of Degrees and Certificates Awarded 2018-19 through 2022-23

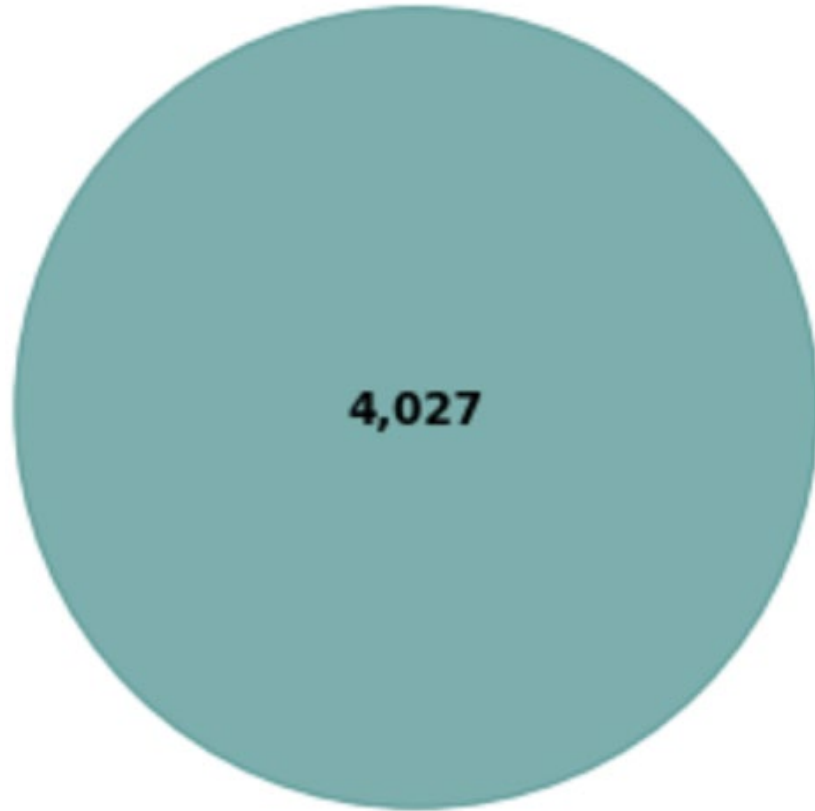
First Requirement for SCFF-Funded Awards

- 3. Certificates – 16 units+ (2 points)**

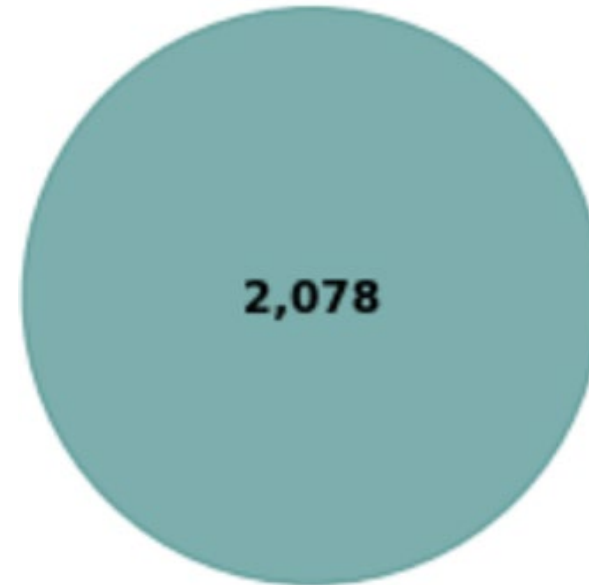

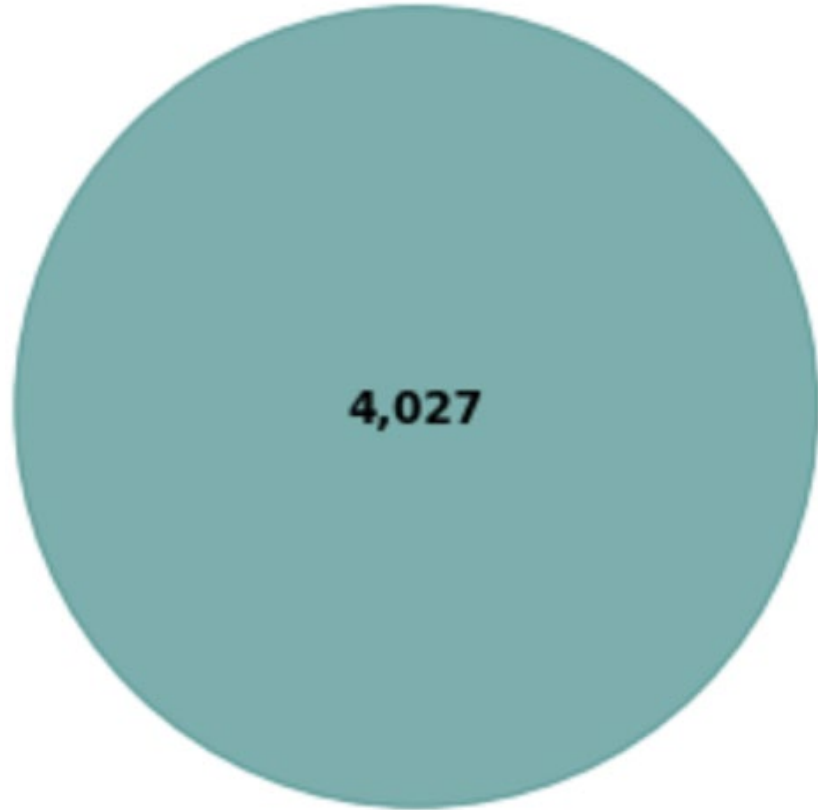

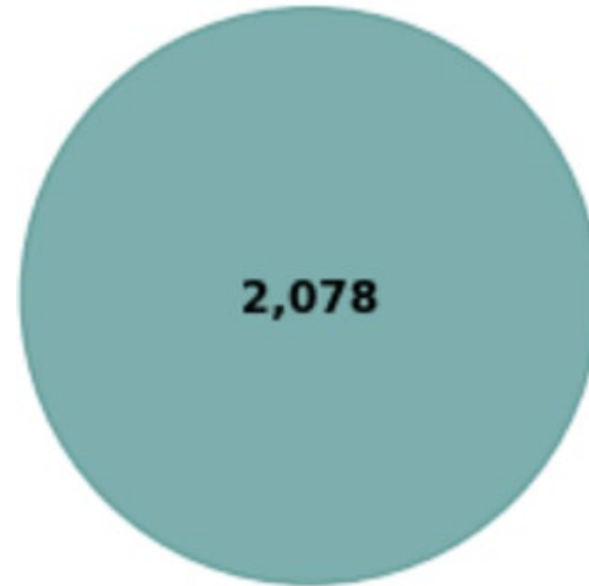

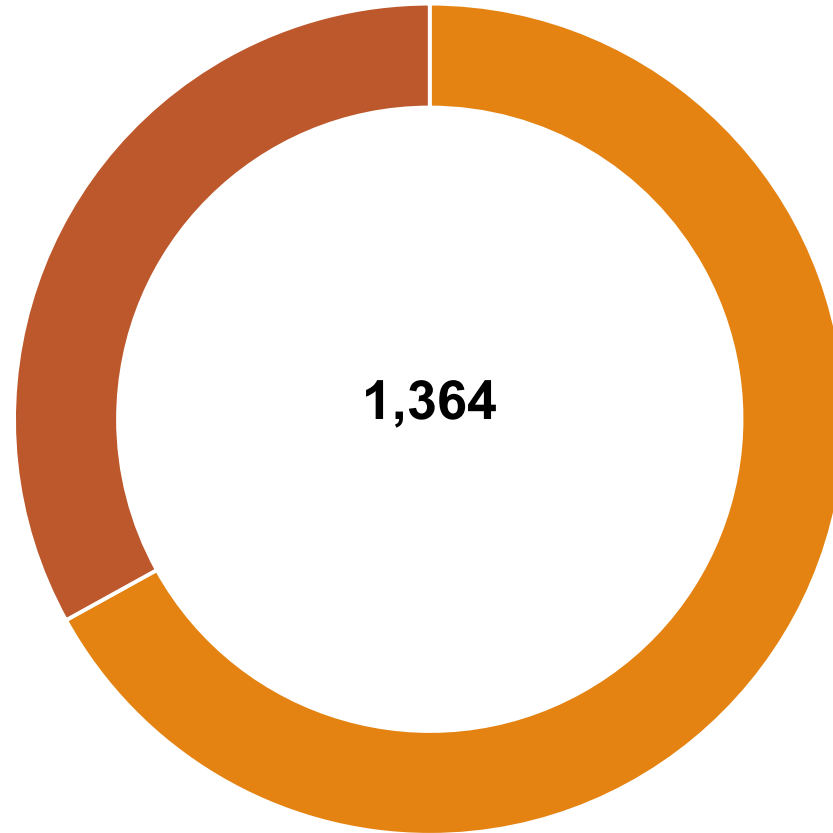

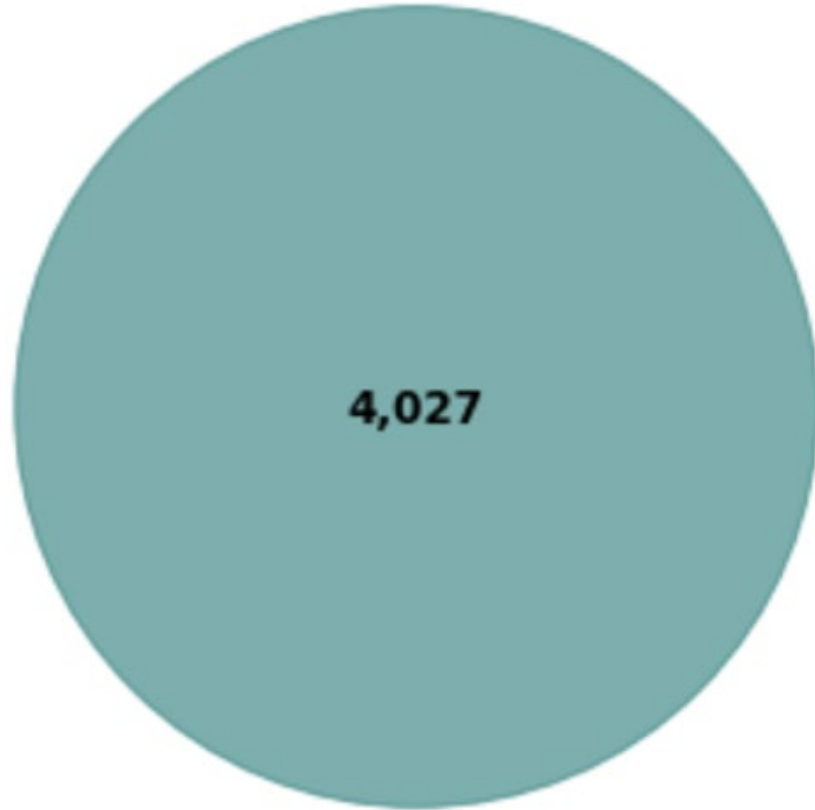

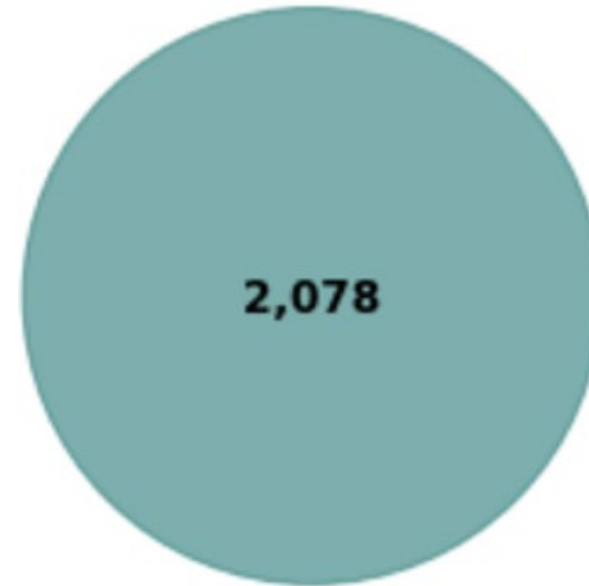
