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assessment of student learning. Those assessment results are then discussed within each discipline and across the college.

Student Learning Outcomes (SLOs) are the observable or measurable results students achieve after completing a course, a program, or interacting with a student service area. Assessment of SLOs is regularly done at the courselevel (CSLO) and mapped to the program-level (PSLO), and at the institutional-level (ISLO). In regular cycles, analysis of course-level, program-level, and institutionallevel SLOs is completed for ongoing feedback and implementation of ideas for improvement. Assessment results are entered into eLumen by full-time and parttime faculty. Through the process, faculty dialog is central to SLO work. Collegial dialog about assessment results takes place at discipline meetings, division meetings, SLO committee meetings, and staff development workshops. Evidence of collegial dialog is found in meeting minutes and in program review documents. The assessment of student learning is a significant part of the program review and resource allocation processes at Las Positas College.

Assessment results are used to identify gaps in student performance and stimulate discussion and direct activities to improve instructional delivery and support systems on campus. Results will not be used as the basis of evaluation or disciplinary action for individual faculty members. However, as part of the faculty's professional responsibilities, instructors are expected to participate in the SLO process.
