Las Positas College collects data from CCCApply and the College Application in order to determine where there is an interest in additional athletic programs at the institution. This data is checked against local high school athletic participation to determine the long-term success and feasibility of starting a new program. As a result of utiling this data, women's water polo was added in 2015 and women's indoor volleyball was added in 2018.

We are in the process of performing our due dilligence (curriculum development, financial analysis, etc.) as it relates to adding women's softball. Our recently completed facility master plan includes a softball complex. With over 411 participants from 17 schools within our recruiting district, along with top local softball travel programs as well as local perenial powerhouses Amador Valley and Foohill high schools in the Las Positas College service area, softball is a viable option.

Additionally, with 708 track and field total athletes from 18 schools in the immediate surrounding area, this sport is another option for Las Positas College especially with a facility already located on campus.
