COMMUNITY GUIDE TO CAMPUS RESOURCES



Important Note ...

Purpose: Numerous requests from various organizations serving homeless and low-income residents within the Tri-Valley area resulted in this publication. The purpose of this guide is to increase community awareness of available campus services targeting low-income individuals and families who have a desire to go to college. Las Positas College has a wealth of resources that provide additional support to students attending our campus. We hope you find this guide useful as you navigate opportunities for personal advancement.

Eligibility: Eligibility guidelines throughout this booklet are *generally stated*. Further inquiry to clearly determine eligibility for supportive services is required and contact information for each service is listed in this publication.

How to Use this Guide: See table of contents for a list of campus resources with the corresponding page numbers and make sure to review all the information. The guide begins with common questions asked by service providers within the community. Each question is followed by a general answer and references to various sections of the guide targeting the need-based question.

Follow the steps in this order:

- 1. Create an account through CCCApply
- 2. Complete the application to Las Positas College through CCCApply
- 3. Apply for financial aid to help pay for college (even if you do not think you qualify)
- 4. Complete the online orientation
- 5. Complete the assessment
- 6. Complete a student education plan

PLEASE NOTE:

Steps 1-4 can be completed <u>off campus</u> if there is access to technology.

Steps 5 and 6 must be completed on campus.

You may contact the homeless liaison if you would like support with any of the required steps to enrollment.





Are there resources for me if I cannot afford to pay for food?

Yes. The Market is brought to you by our Las Positas College Student Government (LPCSG). This event is typically held on a monthly basis in front of Building 1600. Free groceries are available on a first-come, firstserve basis until food runs out. A CalFresh representative is also available at The Market events. This representative can answer questions and give you more information about how to apply for CalFresh, a county-based program that helps low-income households purchase groceries.

Where do I go for help if I am a current/former foster youth?

Go to the second floor of Building 1600 Room 1668 where our Foster Youth Liaisons are located. They will be happy to help you and can refer you to different programs on campus that can further assist you.

School has always been hard; are there campus resources I can use?

If school has been difficult due to a diagnosed disability, you can contact the Disabled Student Programs & Services (DSPS) office to work with you and determine if you are eligible. Tutoring, English, Math, Reading and Writing, Counseling, and other services are available on campus to <u>current</u> students to promote academic success.





Can I go to school if I am not a citizen?

Yes. There are options for non-citizens. Your residency is determined by the information you provide on your application to Las Positas College. If you have questions regarding your residency status, go to the Admissions & Records office on the second floor of Building 1600.

**ALL students, regardless of circumstance or status, should apply for Financial Aid to see if they are eligible to receive support. For information on students with alternative non-citizen residency status, see the "Undocumented Students" page of this document.

Can I get help with my mental, learning or physical disability?

Yes. The Disabled Student Programs & Services (DSPS) program provides support services, specialized instruction, and educational accommodations to students with various disabilities. DSPS is located on the first floor of Building 1600 in Room 1610.

Is there low-cost or free childcare available to students?

Yes. There is a Child Development Center on the Las Positas College campus. For information on the 2Gen Fund Scholarship and childcare options, please contact the Center directly. See "Childcare" section of this publication for more information.

The county offers free childcare services for students who are eligible to participate in the CalWORKs program. See "CalWORKs" for more information





I am a single adult with little/no income, what options do I have?

You can apply for Financial Aid and the California College Promise Grant (via the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) or the California Dream Act Application (CADAA). If you end up being eligible for financial aid, then you can seek federal work study opportunities. Also, you can apply for EOPS which is a program that provides additional support for low-income students.

I am a low income parent and have to work to take care of my family, what options do I have?

You have the same financial aid and supportive services benefits as the previously answered question for single adults with little/no income. You can also apply for CalWORKs and CARE, which are programs that provide additional resources for low-income students who have dependent minors.

Can I go to college and get financial help if I have a criminal record?

Yes. You can still go to college despite your criminal record. If you are on probation or parole or living in a halfway house, you may be eligible for federal student aid. However, the details of your criminal record will determine your eligibility. Your level of funding varies and is dependent upon the type of conviction. See "Financial Aid" for more information.



Frequentity Asked Ouestions

Are there resources to help homeless students or students at-risk of becoming homeless?

Yes. Las Positas College has various resources to help support homeless students or students who are at-risk of becoming homeless including Financial Aid, transportation services (Wheels, Rapid and ACE Rail), shower facilities, food resources (The Market and CalFresh), EOPS, DSPS, and the Student Health & Wellness Center. How can I get to my classes if I don't have transportation?

Las Positas College students may ride all Wheels and Rapid bus routes without having to pay for the bus fare upon boarding with payment of the transportation fee. Students also get a 50% discount on monthly passes and 20-ride tickets for ACE Rail by presenting their student ID at the Livermore Transit Center. Your Las Positas College student ID is your bus pass!

If you do not already have your student ID, you can obtain it at the Online Service Center on the second floor of Building 1600 Room 1672.

Free services include physical exams, over the counter medications, band-aids, ice packs, and condoms, flu shot, TB testing, lactation room, crisis counseling, 8 counseling sessions per semester, etc. Low cost services include various immunizations, diagnostic laboratory testing and screenings, STI testing, etc. crisis counseling, 8 counseling sessions each semester, clinical breast exams, pregnancy testing, lactation room, etc.

Who is eligible:	Undocumented and non-resident students **Must be undocumented, have a valid or expired DACA, hold a U visa, have Temporary Protected Status (TPS), or meet the non-resident exemption requirements under AB540. Also, must meet the financial criteria for eligibility.
Program Benefits:	If you're a noncitizen without a Social Security card or had one issued through the federal Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals program, you should fill out the California Dream Act Application found at: <u>caldreamact.org</u> . If your FAFSA or DREAM application results indicate you have sufficient unmet financial need and you are a <u>California resident or you have established</u> <u>AB540 status</u> You will automatically be provided a tuition fee waiver under this program!
