Your 2019–2020 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) was selected for review in a process called verification. The law says that before awarding Federal Student Aid, we may ask you to confirm the information you reported on your FAFSA. To verify that you provided correct information the financial aid administrator at your school will compare your FAFSA with the information on this worksheet and with any other required documents. If there are differences, your FAFSA information may need to be corrected. You must complete and sign this worksheet, attach any required documents, and submit the form and other required documents to the financial aid administrator at your school. Your school may ask for additional information. If you have questions about verification, contact your financial aid administrator as soon as possible so that your financial aid will not be delayed.

1. TAX RETURN FILERS—**Important Note:** If you (or your spouse, if married) filed, or will file, an amended 2017 IRS tax return, you must contact your financial aid administrator before completing this section.

Instructions: Complete this section if you, the student, filed or will file a 2017 income tax return with the IRS. *The best way to verify income is by using the **IRS Data Retrieval Tool** that is part of FAFSA on the Web. If you have not already used the tool, go to FAFSA.gov, log in to your FAFSA record, select "Make FAFSA Corrections," and navigate to the Financial Information section of the form. From there, follow the instructions to determine if you are eligible to use the IRS Data Retrieval Tool to transfer 2017 IRS income tax information into your FAFSA. If you need more information about when, or how to use the IRS Data Retrieval Tool see your financial aid administrator. If you do not use or are not able to use the IRS Data Retrieval Tool, you must request an IRS Tax Return Transcript directly from the IRS to verify your 2017 income.*

You will need your Social Security Number, date of birth, and the address on file with the IRS (normally this will be the address used when your 2017 IRS tax return was filed).*
- Check here if an IRS tax return transcript(s) or copies of the income tax returns attached to this worksheet.
- Check here if IRS tax return transcript(s) or copies of the income tax returns will be submitted to your school later. Verification cannot be completed until the IRS tax return or transcript(s) has been submitted to your school.

2. TAX RETURN NONFILERS—Complete this section if you, the student (and, if married, your spouse), will not file and are not required to file a 2017 income tax return with the IRS. **If you did not file a federal tax return, you (and your spouse if married) are required to submit a 'Verification of Non-filing' letter from the I.R.S.**

Request a 'Verification of Non-filing' letter from the IRS at www.irs.gov. a) In the Tools section on the homepage, click "Get a Transcript" b) Click "Get Transcript Online" c) Under "First Time User", select "Get Started". If you already have an account, enter your user ID under "Returning Users" section 5. If you are unable to register or you prefer not to use the "Get Transcript Online" option, you must complete the 4506-T Form.

Check the box that applies:

- The student (and, if married, the student's spouse) was not employed and had no income earned from work in 2017. Students are required to submit a '**Verification of Non-filing letter**'.
- The student (and/or the student's spouse if married) was employed in 2017 and has listed on the next page the names of all employers, the amount earned from each employer in 2017, and whether an IRS W-2 form is attached. Attach a '**Verification of Non-filing letter**' for student (and spouse, if married), and must submit copies of all 2017 W-2 forms issued to you (and, if married, to your spouse) by employers.
