I. Welcome/Call to Order – Sharon Glealled the meeting to order at 12:05 p.m. A Quorum was present.

II. Discussion with President Walthers – In light of the extremely difficult financial situation our District, as well as most Districts in the State, are in, President Walthers asked to visit the Classified Senate meeting and converse about circumstances, and answer questions.

He emailed a memo to 'All LPC' this morning with the text of the 'layoff letters' that had to be given to 7 LPC Classified Staff members this week. This is in preparation for the June 12th special Board meeting.) The email memo is appended to these minutes, and begins "I am sure most of you are aware that we had to deliver devastating news to several staff members this week ... Our hearts go out to the affected individuals as they are our colleagues and friends."

Most of the conversation Dr. Walthers' had with the Classified Staff present is summarized here. Dr. Walthers stated that he, the Chancellor, the H.R. Administrators, and the Vice Presidents thought long and hard about the options and needs of the students, college and district before deciding on 7 layoffs for LPC (additional layoffs at Chabot College are occurring, and several vacant positions at the District Office are being suspended or eliminated).

Earlier this week, each of the Classified Staff members affected by layoffs met individually with Dr. Walthers, and their Vice President, and Dean, in some cases. They were given an informational letter, the text of which is in the email memo attached. There are transition services available through the District, and the District and supervisors are allowing ample time for job interviews, as well as encouraging the individuals in every way they can.

One staffer asked if the people laid off would have a better chance of getting reassigned to one of the vacant district positions, even if they didn't have all the qualifications.

Dr. Walthers referred this to the H.R. department, and thought that for highly skilled qualifications this could be tricky. H.R. could provide more information to specific individuals based on their actual situation and knowledge/training.

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It was asked how many LPC staff may be affected by 'SEIU bumping rights'?

Dr. Walthers mentioned that only 1 fulltime LPC staffer may be affected by bumping rights, and they have been notified of this; and that one .25 staffer may be affected. This will alep: on and Class Staffers at 100 Aits.

The question was raised about the number of Chabot and District staff affected by layoffs.

Dr. Walthers replied that he did not have the specifics with him, however Chabot was able to reduce some costs by reducing some 12 month employees to 11 month work, and 11 month employees to 10 month work schedule! District will not be filling most of the open positions; these have not been filled for many months and are being 'suspended' for the next year.

One person asked how the LPC Child Development Center layoffs will affect the 'bottom line'.

The president replied that in its first year, this year, the CDC has had to be subsidized by about \$170,000, as it is a start-up year, and y runs as a model laboratory school. The savings will, therefore, be significant.

Dr. Walthers also mentioned that the District still needs to find somewhere between \$600,000 - \$900,000 in savings to balance the budget. This is even after each of the 3 sites found \$1.5M in cuts. The District and Board were hoping that an SEIU settlement would occur this year, affording some of those savings, however this has not happened, therefore a new scenario is being developed.

Dr. Walthers shared that if the District needs to find savings by not offering certain programs in the 2013-14 year, faculty contracts require that conversations about this need to begin in October of 2012. The funding difficulties in California are so severe that 'we may not be able to afford to hang on to certain programs.'

He went on to compliment and thank Classified Staff for all the jobs they do, and all the extra they take on at their work stations, as well as volunteering for events for students and prospective. He is impressed that we continue to serve students with the utmost professionalism, and is especially awed that we take on special projects and do more than 'the basics'.

Ms. Ulrech urged that for the confidentiality and sensitivity of those impacted by layoffs, that we be discreet, not discuss this with others, and advocate to others to not spread rumors or discuss questions that are not within their purview. A lack of sensitivity in this sobering situation could be difficult for those affected. May present also agree at

Subject: Budget Recommendations

Colleagues,

I am sure most of you are aware that we had to deliver devastating news to several staff members this week the news that the College's budget reduction recommendation to the Board includes elimination of their position or that their position may be bumped by a more senior staff member. Our hearts go out to the affected individuals as they are our colleagues and friends.

Below is the text of the letter we drafted for each impacted staff member - it contains information that many of you may ask or be asked:

Our action is taken to address the serious fiscal constraints that are unprecedented in the history of our district and will be conducted in accordance with the collective bargaining agreement. The recommendation will go to the Board of Trustees for action on June 12, 2012. Upon approval by the Board, you will receive official notification from the District indicating the last day of work for this position will be July 31, 2012.

This recommendation is based solely on the budget crisis and bears no reflection on your work nor the quality of service you have provided to the students of Las Positas College.

We understand that you will have many questions and encourage you to contact Wyman Fong or James Andrews with CLPCCD Human Resource Services (925-485-5236). They are standing ready to assist you in this transition with services that include:

- Information on bumping rights;
- Opportunities to apply for three current vacancies through the expression of interest process; and,
- Access to the District's Employee Assistance Program.

I appreciate that you will take time to offer encouragement to these individuals.

Again, thank you for all that you do for the students of Las Positas College.


