I suggest that in the future we send more than one representative to this conference. It was difficult for one representative to get all the information that was available to the attendees.

It gave the attendees an opportunity to hear the accomplishments and/or contributions made by Classified Staff in their leadership roles from other community colleges. This year Las Positas College Classified Senate was given recognition as the 2011 California Community Colleges Model Classified Senate award, which I was glad to accept this award on behalf the Las Positas College Classified Senate.
