

What is IPBM?

IPBM stands for Integrated Planning and Budget Model. In Fall of 2013 CLPCCD Chancellor lackson commissioned a work group consisting of faculty, classified, students and administrators from the colleges and district to develop a process of communicating needs and information on a district-wide level. AB 2558

This bill passed both Houses and was signed into law by the Governor on Sept. 19, 2014. It eliminates the existing Community College Faculty and Staff Development Fund and establishes the Community College Professional Development Program that will be governed by the Board of Governors. It modifies the language to include staff development funding for classified and administrators, and specifies that any time used for Professional Development shall be counted toward hours worked.



four of the new committees is made up

The Model was approved by the Board of Trustees in April of 2014 and the committees began their work this fall. The diagram shows how information and decisions flow from the colleges to the committees to the Chancellor and Board. This is a new process and may take a little time to fully integrate it into the college's planning and governance structure but the belief is that it will increase transparency and communication between the colleges and district.
