- **CSU GE Area F: Ethnic Studies** **Craig Kutil**
 The Title V changes & AB 1460 were reviewed. This will be effective Fall 2021. CSU's need to have Ethnic Studies course at every campus. People graduating in 2024-2025 need to have completed this new Area F. Any courses that count for this area need to be part of these specific areas: Native Americans, African

Americans, Asian Americans and Latina and Latino Americans. A course was removed from Area D and will be replaced with this new Area F, in order not to effect TMC's. There may be updates however to double counting. CSU GE for STEM & IGETC are still up in the air. We may need to update our courses with the required core competencies to fit this area. If so, he will reach out to the faculty with courses that meet American Institutions and diversity requirement at CSU East Bay to make these updates. He will keep us posted when there is more information, specifically regarding the potential that all courses that fit this area may need to be under their own Ethnic Studies prefix (potentially cross list courses). The deadline for Articulation Officers to submit for approval in this area will be February.
