5.	Productivity by Discipline Discussion Dean McElderry: This is something we briefly discussed before. It's a proposal for us to consider if we'd like to use it. It's basically using productivity as the basis of for the discipline planning process; we have not done this in the past. We've focused on FTES generation. Productivity needs to be a major focus of ours. It's built into the FA contract (Article 26); district enrollment management was established by the contract in 2002. CEMC's role is to help disciplines develop plans to meet a particular productivity goal. Two documents were shared for discussion: Productivity Goals & Discipline Planning; Productivity Planning Steps.
