6.	Fill Rates for Spring Semester by Weeks         Director Samra reporting: Sharing data about the last 11 springs semesters and the fill rates by week (Spring 2014 – 2024). It's important because it gives us a hint to where our number will be in the next few weeks and beyond. Data shows we tend to hit the peak at week one during the semester. Our numbers tend to stabilize at week 4. These fill rates are connected to other metrics we have in our enrollment data sheet. For example, we are at 472 productivity right now, and looking at past years it's likely that by week four we'll be around 457-ish. And based on these trends we'll probably be down about 2.9 percent in terms of FTES. But late start classes are not yet filled so there's still hope. Spring 24 is doing well compared to the last 11 springs. Discussion
