The courses in the Humanities program are important components of the general education requirements of many students of our transfer students. The courses all have a very high fill rate, with all courses filling at or very near capacity every term. The courses are also important components of several degrees offered at our college. Some specifics are listed below:

- \* All courses in Humanities transfer to UC and CSU
- \* 5 out of the 6 courses in Humanities are IGETC and CSU GE certified
- \* 5 out of the 6 Humanities courses are integral parts of an AA or AAT degree, including the AA in Humanities and the AAT in Philosophy.

Humanities, Philosophy, and Religious Studies are coordinated as a cluster. At this time, Dr. Klaschus is the coordinator for all 3 disciplines, working in consultation with Jeremiah Bodnar, the full-time Philosophy instructor. Eliminating the Humanities position after the departure of Dr. Klaschus would leave one full time faculty member (whose primary expertise is in philosophy) to coordinate all 3 programs: Philosophy, Humanities, and Religious Studies.

8. What are the impacts on students, the discipline and the college of NOT filling this faculty position? What are the programs/courses/services that have not been or cannot be offered due to the vacancy? (Be brief and specific. Use your Program Review to complete this section.)

The most significant impact of not filling the position in Humanities after the departure of Dr. Klaschus would be to leave the entire discipline of Humanities without a full-time instructor. Without a single expert to coordinate the discipline there is a serious risk of impaired communication among part time faculty, difficulty completing and updating of SLO's within the discipline, delays in program updates and modifications, including updates to curriculum and the AA Degree, difficulty with discipline planning, and limited perspective and vision applied to the program review process. Programs left without a single full-time faculty have the possibility of suffering steep declines which can affect the vitality of the college as a whole.

Because the Humanities program has very strong enrollment numbers and high productivity (filling very consistently at or above the 45 student capacity), the decline in the Humanities program could well affect the productivity numbers in the college as a whole. Humanities is also a discipline in which it is difficult to find part-time instructors. One reason for this difficulty is the relative dearth of programs offering a Ph. D. or MA specifically in Humanities. In spite of solicitations for part time instructors in Humanities we have had difficulty locating faculty with the expertise to teach our additional courses even with the presence of a full-time humanities faculty. Without the presence of a full time faculty member, this difficulty is expected to increase greatly. If the full range of Humanities courses cannot be offered because of staffing considerations it may be difficult to keep the Humanities AA degree a viable option for students. A restriction in course offerings would also take away an important set of general education courses used by students preparing to transfer to four year colleges. A reduction in course offerings would also affect the other programs for which humanities courses are within the restricted electives for their degrees. These programs include English, Philosophy, and Environmental Studies.

Important Note: At the time this request was submitted the projected FTEF in the discipline was listed at 100%, assuming the position is filled with a new hire. It is important to realize that this projection was made without taking the retirement of Dr. Klaschus into account. The true estimated FTEF should be considered closer to 65% because hiring a Humanities instructor will simply result in the replacement of the current instructor who is retiring. As of 9/10 we were asked by the Director of Institutional Research and Planning to leave these projections unchanged until the Faculty Hiring Prioritization Committee released an official set of numbers which would take this year's retirements into account.
