Without a full-time faculty member to lead the program, multiple courses have not been completed in the curriculum process. Work on the AA and four new courses has begun but is incomplete because there is no full-time person shepherding the process and completing the curriculum. Overall, it is detrimental to the college and the arts programming, especially in terms of growth and/or expansion of the arts if this position continues unfilled. LPC should be striving to grow its art program in all respects, and having a leader in the Art History discipline benefits that goal.

We often think of art majors as being those who make art. But there is an entire art industry which exists due to the work of those who love art but don't make art.
