A recent study of high school counselors (June 2016, as presented at the Town Meeting in September 2016) includes specific feedback to expand LPC's presence at the high school campuses. This equipment strongly supports the first planning priority. Accreditation standard 2.A.16 reads "The institution regularly evaluates and improves the quality and currency of all \*\*\*instructional programs offered in the name of the institution\*\*\*, including collegiate, pre-collegiate, career-technical, and continuing and community education courses and programs, \*\*\*regardless of delivery mode or location\*\*\*."

This equipment supports the Psychology-Counseling instructional program. This equipment would also support outreach efforts for the Counseling program.

This equipment supports the following initiatives from the Counseling Program Review update: "As LPC grows in enrollment, there is an increased need for support for student orientation programs (College Day, HS Parent Night, Program Planning, Campus Orientation/tours) beyond Counseling." and "One of the big projects being planned and implemented in the 16-17 academic year, is a restructured and redeveloped student orientation process. The 3SP workgroup is improving the student orientation model to make it more engaging, involve other departments (e.g. Student Life, Admissions and Records, etc.), and to increase retention of information throughout the orientation process. Portions of the reworked orientation will be implemented beginning with Sp'17 Early Admissions program."

#### SECTION 5: TEACHING AND LEARNING

#### Describe in detail the impact this equipment will have on teaching:

This equipment will allow PSCN instructors to take full advantage of the newly legislated ability to offer the Transition to College course at the high school site, without concern for the technological capabilities of the high school site.

#### Describe in detail the impact this equipment will have on <u>learning</u>:

This equipment will facilitate student learning by meeting students where they are, regardless of how well or poorly resourced their high school may be. With functioning teaching equipment, student learning will be enhanced, and students will be more likely to consider Las Positas College as a viable higher education option.

With this equipment, \*\*\*all\*\*\* of the following SLOs will be able to be fulfilled \*\*\* on-site \*\*\* for our Early Admission high school students (over the long-term):

- Student will develop at least a one semester abbreviated student education plan (SEP).
- Students will complete the English/Math assessments to determine their placement for English and Math classes.
- Students will demonstrate awareness of 5 campus resources.

#### What are the consequences related to learning outcomes if request is not funded?

It will be difficult to fully take advantage of the enhanced legislated ability to offer Transition to College strategies at the high school site, given the inconsistent nature of instructional support at the local high schools. Students will meet each SLO individually, in various locations which vary in accessibility and convenience, instead of as part of a PSCN 25 course offered at the high school site.

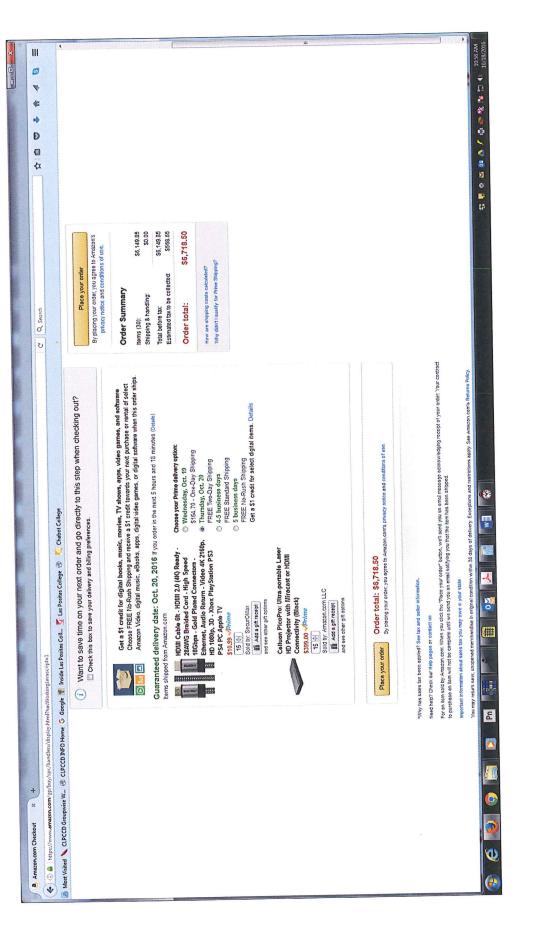
