Theater specifically, but also all classes that get placed in the rehearsal room. Currently, rehearsals are often held in the black box, making this space unavailable for events, rentals, and performances.

The curtains are not in the program review, though our program review does have a strong focus on facility upgrades and space use this year. The original intention of the rehearsal room was for the drama program specifically (the room is even called the Drama Rehearsal Room on the wall plate). We view the implementation of the intended curtains not to be a program review request, but a request that the college honor the intended use of the space, when originally designed.

SECTION 5: TEACHING AND LEARNING

Describe in detail the impact this equipment will have on <u>teaching</u>:

Curtains would allow us close off the mirror, which is critical in rehearsal. Having curtains would allow us to 1) block off the visuals and 2) protect the cleanliness of the mirrors, so that the theater and dance instructors and maintainance don't have to clean them constantly.

Describe in detail the impact this equipment will have on learning:

If the students face the mirrors, their own movements and behavior becomes modified by their own self-conscious awareness of the staging. If we have them face the other direction, the visual stage picture is made muddy but the inclusion of the chairs, piano, people in rehearsal, etc. The room was built to replicate the size of the black box and main stage, as much as possible, so any other orientation doesn't really work.

Our Performance in Production SLO's speak to students creating physical and believable characters for the stage. Having a mirror in your vision can often hinder that, creating a self-consciousness in the work and rehearsal space.

Most other classes on campus would not require the students to watch themselves as they worked. Theater students too should have the option to work on their process without such immediate feedback to allow a deeper and more truthful process. Failure to provide that space could hinder the ability for performance students and teachers are all levels in the program to reach those outcomes authentically.

DETAILED PROJECT SPECIFICATIONS PROVIDE AND INSTALL THEATRICAL CURTAINS

PRODUCTS: Curtains shall be constructed of new material and shall meet Flame Retardant Specifications of the California State Fire Marshall. A label stating the registration number of the manufacturer/supplier, and the dimensions shall be stitched on each unit. Curtains shall be constructed out of IFR 24oz Crescent fabric, color Colonial Brick and shall have 50% Box Pleated Fullness sewn in; Shirred fullness, Z and Knife Pleating shall not be used.

QUANTITIES:

Bi-Parting Pair, each panel 10'0"H x 26'0"W

CONSTRUCTION: Curtains shall be manufactured by experienced personnel specializing in the construction of theatrical stage draperies. Curtains shall be sewn to 3-1/2" heavy jute webbing using industrial duty sewing machines. Curtains shall be finished with snaps above on 6" centers at the top, 1/2 width foldback center, 3" outside hems; and 6" hem at the bottom. A Musson installation technician will verify measurements and hardware after receiving order.

INSTALLATION: Track hardware is included (list attached). Attachment hardware to building structure is not included. Musson Theatrical Inc. is a state licensed stage equipment contractor. Lic. #554811. Musson Theatrical is not a structural engineer and makes no representations thereof.

WARRANTY: Musson Theatrical, Inc. provides a 1-year warranty against defects in materials.

If scheduling problems arise, Musson will make every effort to adjust our work schedules around those needs, provided such conflicts are stated in writing at least seven days prior to the installation date. If Musson is not advised of such conflicts, and as a result, the installation cannot proceed as scheduled; a work interruption surcharge of \$105.00 per crew person/per hour may be assessed.
