- Satisfaction with overall structure ranked as very satisfied
- The due date rated as very satisfactory, and one person had an issue
- There were no responses rated a not at all satisfied
- Questions on follow-up did arise regarding the next steps after submittal
- Suggestion to create a template on what happens after someone submits their request
- Clarification on who to contact when an item is missing or damaged needed
- Receipt of requested materials average zero to four months which is faster than previous years

New Business

RAC Tri-Chair/Co-Chair Discussion

- Discussion to encourage more Classified participation with campus committees, including the possible addition of a tri-chair to RAC
- Processes around how a committee runs with a tri-chair are unclear
- Classified Professionals wanted to offer someone a leadership opportunity, including Classified Faculty and Administrators
