o The committee voted unanimously Titian Lish as chair

5. New Business

- 2021 Instructional Equipment Requests
 - New committee introductions
 - o New members received an overview of the committee charge and an outline of the instruction equipment request(IER) process
 - o The committee reviewed the 2021-22 RAC calendar and its corresponding due dates for IER and position requests
 - The early IER submission deadlines are a source of frustration and result in requests to push back the timeline
 - o The receipt of the IER before June 30 is a point of consideration when setting the timeline; arrival after June 30 pushes the cost to the next fiscal year
 - The committee addressed the concerns from the Admin Staff meeting regarding the hiring pause in place during the 2020 Classified and Administration Position requests process
 - A suggestion put forth was to review the 2020 submissions and push forward the relevant requests
 - The committee believed it was important not to disenfranchise new committee members and allow the opportunity to review and rank accordingly
 - Historically, it was an understanding to resubmit each year the positions with lower-ranking to document the division/department need
 - o After thorough discussion, the committee agreed to accept 2020 positions requests along with the 2021 requests

Motion by Nan Ho to allow Classified and Administrative Positions Requests from 20-21 as a submission for 21-22 Second, Lucas Hasten No Opposition or Abstentions Motion passed unanimously

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- In previous years, the bond funded a majority of instructional equipment costs, whereas now the Lottery and Instructional Equipment allocations will cover costs
- To allow program review and new employees to acclimate, a committee member suggested moving the IER process to November with the caveat items requests would not arrive before the end of the current academic year
- o It is important to advertise the IER timeline, including when requested items typically arrive
- The process requires further thought and conversation, especially while working through a pandemic and what it may look like post-pandemic

• Glossary of Terms Brainstorm

- LPC Student Government expressed their LPC acronym fluency limits understanding of subjects during College Council
- o The recommendation is the creation of a glossary of common terms with a centralized location
