Spring 2022 IER Budget Saving Vote

- Instructors expressed their desire to hold a spring round
- A suggestion was to hold off procurement of the lower-ranked IER and utilize the budget savings for a spring round; the items placed on hold would go through the ranking process again in spring
- The committee suggested setting a minimum threshold, and anything falling under the specified number would not move forward in the procurement process
- The ranking process is part of the accreditation process
- In the instance when the budget cannot meet demand, set criteria can prioritize requests
- In previous years a 70% threshold was in place
