

## What are the differences between the Web and subscription databases?

WEB	DATABASES
<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Free (though some commercial sites charge for information)</li><li>• Information retrieved through search engines “dynamically” (i.e., not organized into searchable fields)</li><li>• Information has not necessarily been edited, verified for accuracy, or updated</li><li>• Information comes from anyone who has Web access and wishes to publish a site. Contains information from almost anywhere--government agencies, nonprofit organizations, high-school students, commercial businesses, etc.</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Fee-based (free to LPC students &amp; faculty)</li><li>• Organized into searchable fields (e.g., author, title of article, periodical title, etc.)</li><li>• Information has been checked for accuracy, reliability, and authority</li><li>• Information originally published in books, magazines, journals, and newspapers comes from publishers and is uploaded in electronic format. Information cannot be found using search engines on the Web</li></ul>
