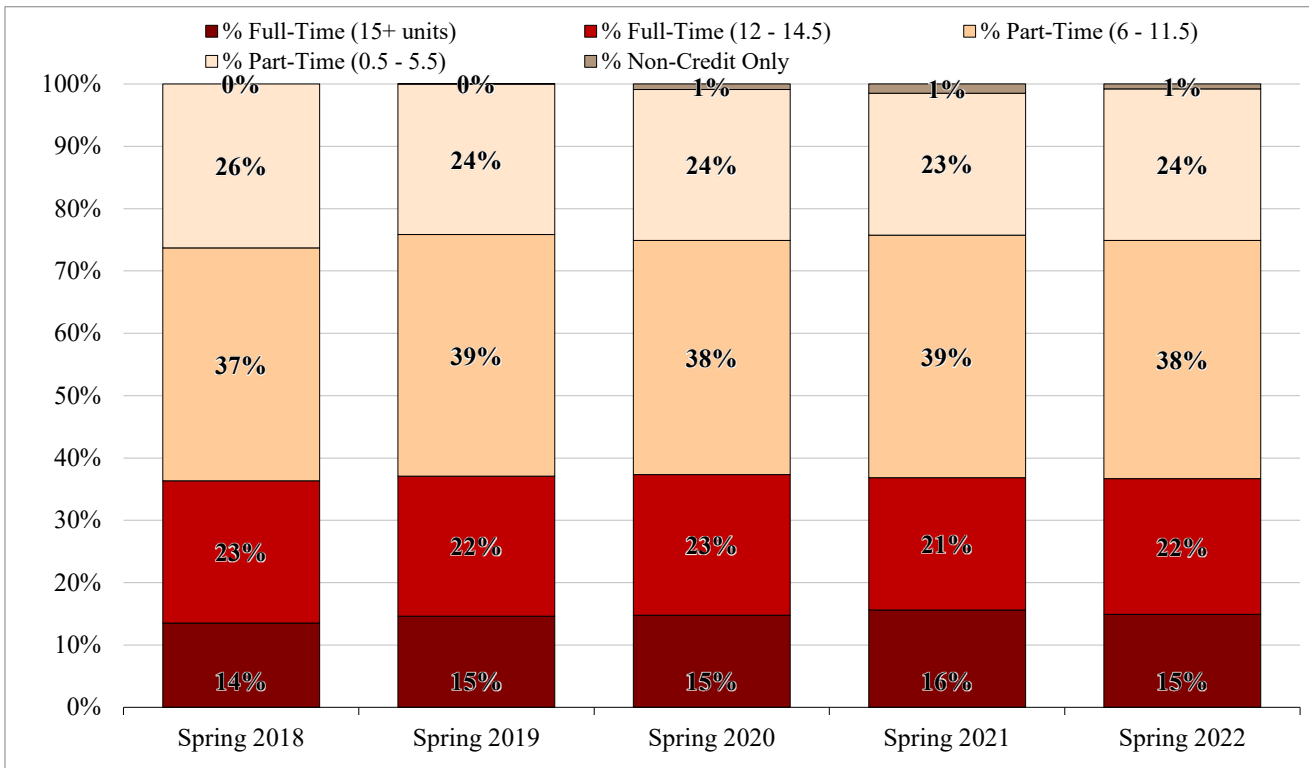
Continuing: Students enrolled in the current semester and were enrolled in the previous primary term. Primary terms are Fall and Spring.

Concurrent Enrollment: A special admit student currently enrolled in K-12.

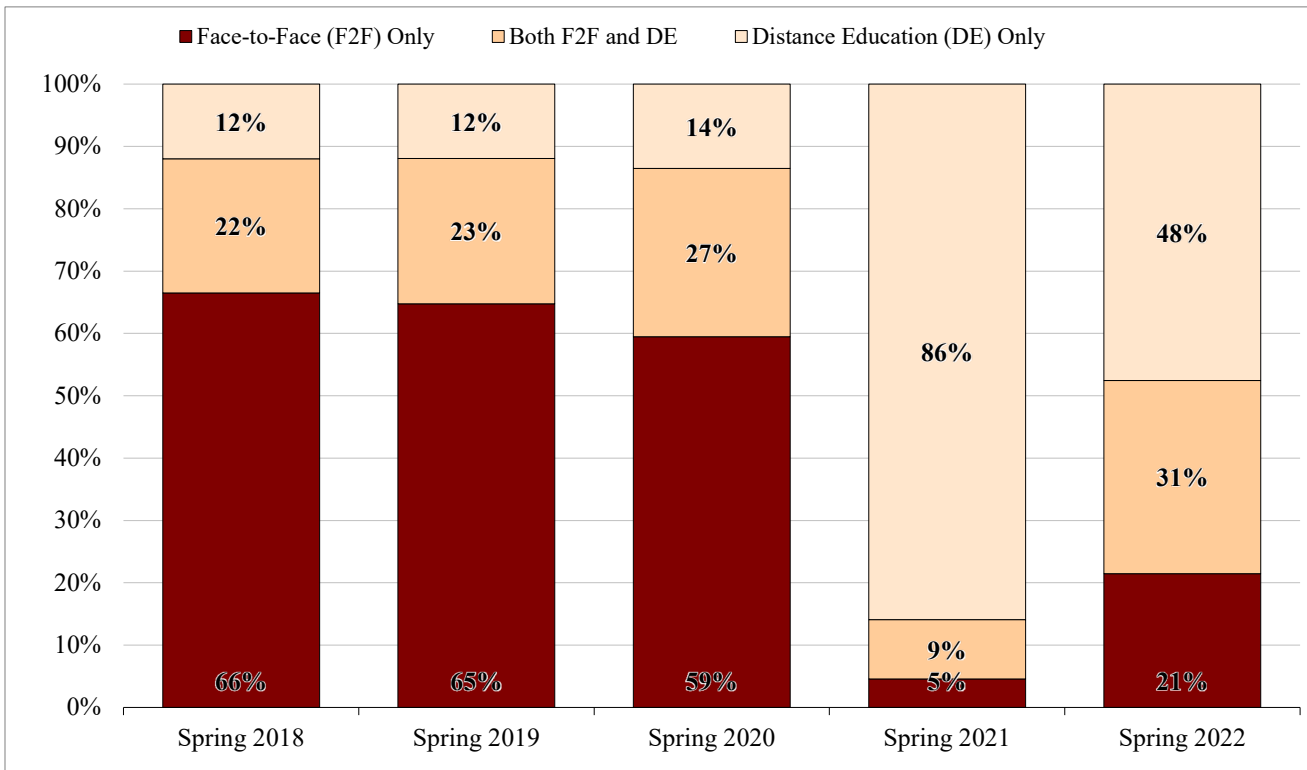

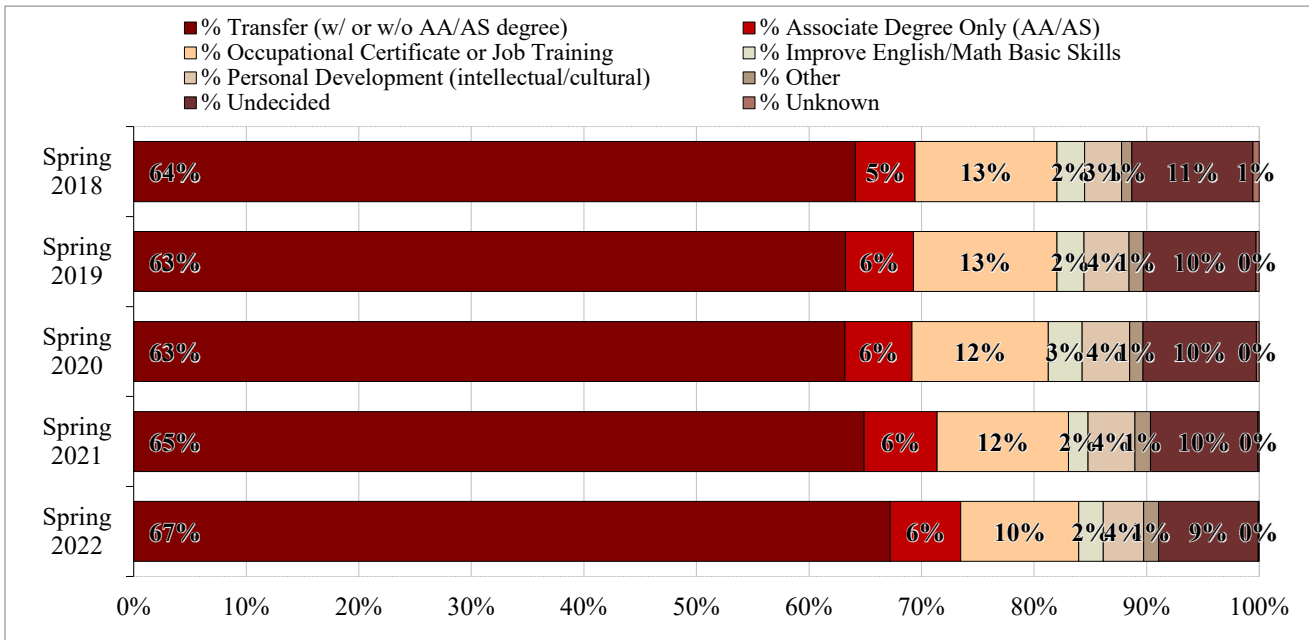

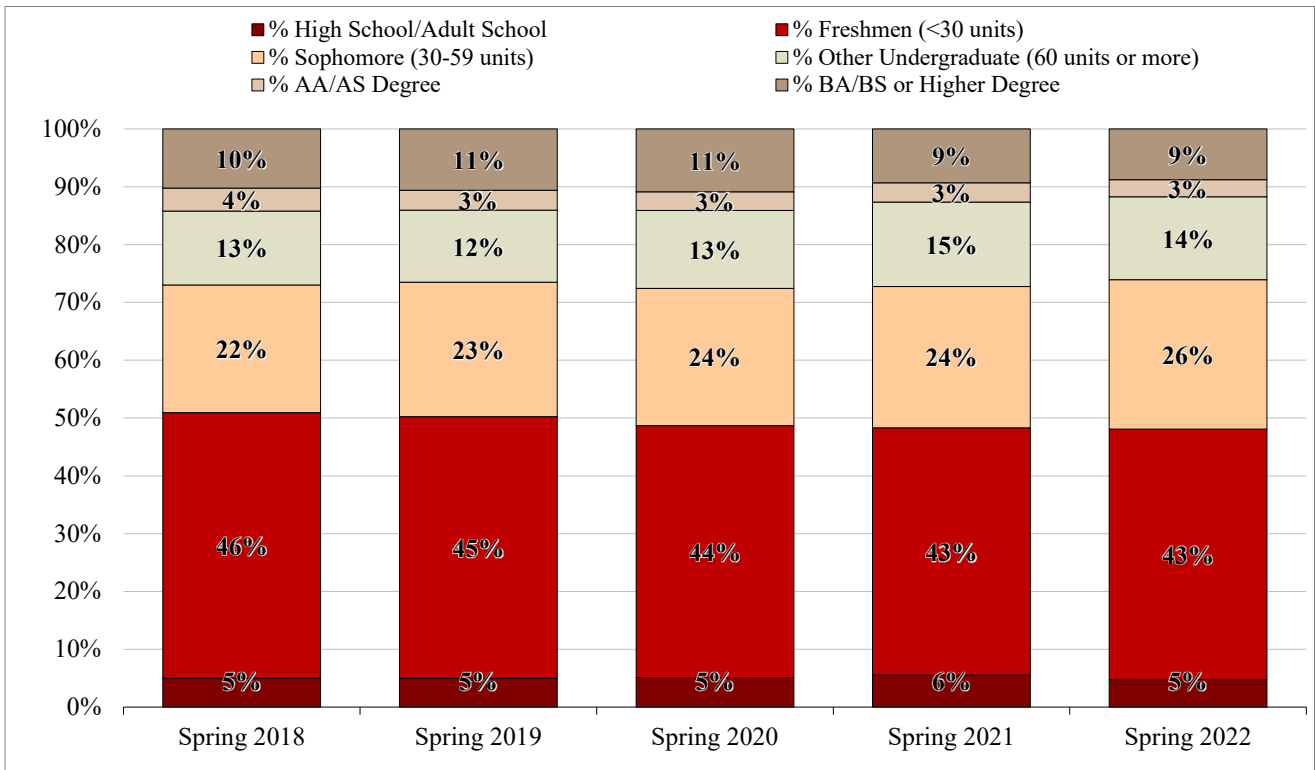

- Other:** Students completing diploma/GED requirements or moving from non-credit to credit courses. Data from admission application.

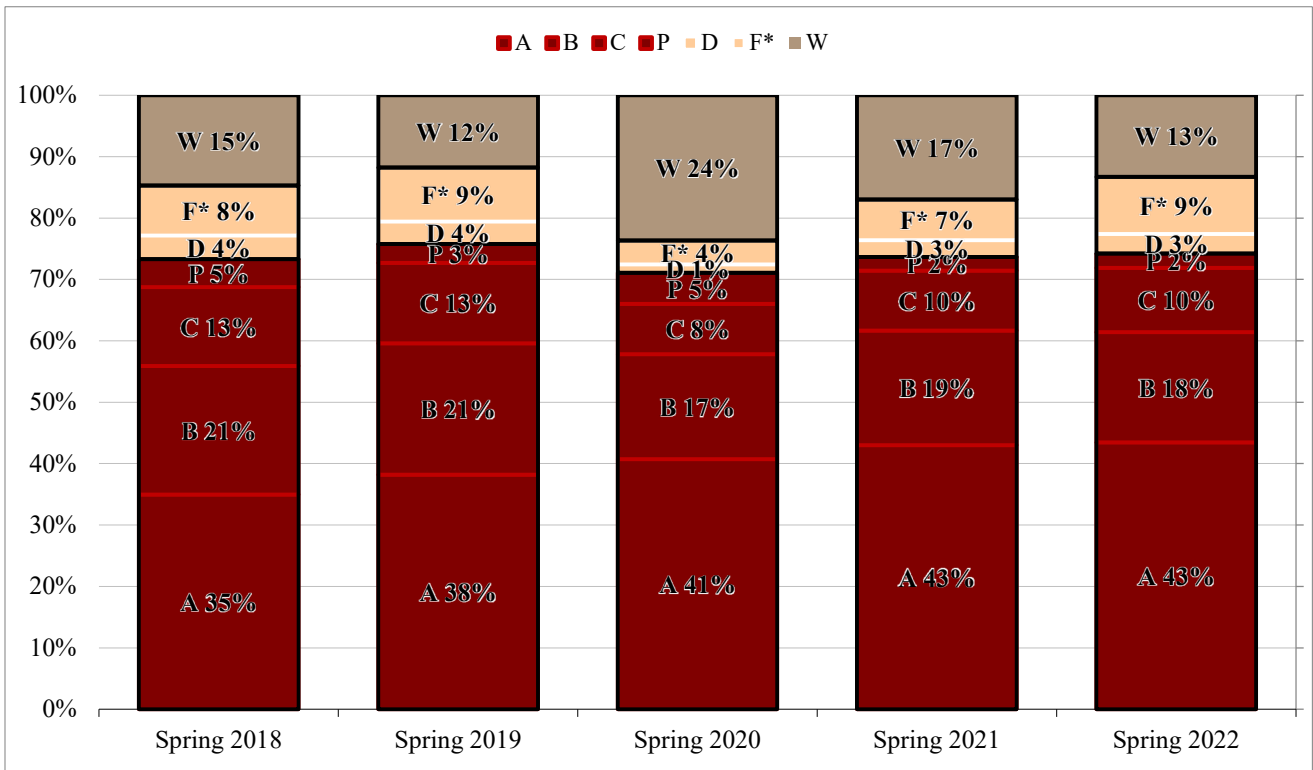
