4. SLO Flex Day Sessions

Ann Hight

Marty Nash discussed that he will lead tomorrow mornings general SLO Session, which will discuss the definition of an SLO, how SLOs are different from measurable objectives, and what PSLO and ISLOs are and how they linked. He has done this session twice before and it lasts approximately 45 minutes. After the lecture, there will be an eLumen tutorial session. There was discussion among the committee whether to show faculty how to create their own assessments in eLumen (using naming convention), as the committee is trying to encourage SLO Coordinators to create common assessments. It was decided that as some departments don't have full time faculty or the SLO Coordinators are not creating common assessments, the session will cover how to create an assessment. However, the presenters will encourage faculty to discuss whether they will be using common assessments with their SLO Coordinator before they create their own assessments. Ann Hight stated that for the afternoon SLO Coordinator Training she and Jennie Graham will go through a PowerPoint explaining SLO Coordinator duties. After the PowerPoint, there will be a breakout sessions to discuss individual program circumstances and discuss best practices. This should include discussion data factors such as on class size, how many students in a section, and frequency of course offering. There will be discussion questions such as: Where are you in your SLO Discipline process? How can examining SLO Data be useful? How common should common assessments be?
