"I graduated from Amador Valley High School in 2016 and enlisted as a combat engineer in the Marine Corps, where I served for four years. During my time stationed in Okinawa, Japan, I began taking college courses. I continued my college journey with Las Positas College shortly after I was honorably discharged from the Marines in 2020. My most memorable experience at Las Positas was making fluorescent bacteria using a jellyfish protein. We spliced the protein transcript into the bacterial genome to make them produce fluorescent protein during Cell and Molecular Biology lab.

During my time in the military, I found a passion for the medical field. My future plans including becoming a medical doctor and changing the world through medicine.

I finished my courses at Las Positas College in the fall of 2021, and I just spent my first semester at The University of Texas at Austin. I eventually plan to use my military and medical school skills to work as a humanitarian physician in conflict zones and underdeveloped countries."

10th Annual HerStory: Honoring Women Veterans

This year, The Veterans First Program hosted the 10th annual Honoring Women Veterans event. This event was hosted on March 9th from 4 pm to 6 pm on Las Positas College Campus.

This event was hosted in honor of women veterans and women on

active duty serving the U.S. military. The women veterans' event is intended to bring awareness to the often-overlooked struggles and triumphs of women serving in the armed forces.



To start the evening Air Force ROTC student Alexandria Quezada-Sermeno performed the National Anthem. This was performed Live in lecture hall 2420. Shortly after, the scheduled talk commenced.

Keynote speaker Virginia Wimmer, US Air Force veteran and Deputy Secretary of Women Veterans Affairs of the California Department of Veterans Affairs, along with Xóchitl Rodriguez Murillo, Deputy Secretary of Minority Veterans Affairs at the California Department of Veterans Affairs welcomed the group. Opening warrior prayer was led by Dr. Doral Gonzalez, retired Lieutenant Colonel, US Army.

These speakers discussed the difficulties that women in the military face. Problems such as sexism and sexual harassment are common issues faced by women in the military.

Veterans Tracey Walker (US Navy Veteran; LPC Fire Academy Graduate), S. (Stephanie) Maria Caballero (US Navy Veteran, LPC Marine Biology major), Arica Steedley (US Army Veteran, Computer Network Technology major), Gissela Agurcia (US





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Marine Corps Veteran, Transfer to SJSU Engineering major), and Marissa Macale (US Air Force Veteran, Pre-Nursing major) took time to tell their own personal stories of their time in the military.

Many of their stories noted a notion in the military that women weren't as capable as men. Each of these veterans had to go to lengths to overcome these notions and prove themselves. Macale's story noted how women's boundaries aren't always respected in the military. She explained how this created an environment where sexual harassment could occur.



Arica talked about the difficulties she experienced being one of the first women in a primarily male unit. She also discussed her experience taking care of her daughter while she was on active duty.

In addition to the speakers, facilitator Adriana Santos, US Marine Corps Veteran and Transfer student to CSU East Bay (History/Teacher Education major) took a moment to summarize the leaps and bounds women veterans have made to contribute to the armed forces and the obstacles they overcome.

Starting at 5 pm scholarships were presented to eligible women veterans attending LPC. Blue Star Moms presented \$500 scholarships to Kenia Vazquez Garcia, Christina Bueno, and Amanda Paustian. Daughters of the American Revolution presented \$500 scholarships to Kenia Vazquez Garcia and Christina Bueno.



Sherry Jensen of the Valley Veterans Foundation presented a \$5,000 scholarship to Arica Steedley. Following the scholarship presentation, Quilts of Valor, an organization that presents custom quilts to veterans to honor their combat service. Recipients include to Christina Marie Bueno (US Air Force veteran), Virginia Wimmer (US Air Force veteran), Victoria Hudson (US Army veteran), and Patty Wernet (Retired US Army Colonel). In addition to presenting to veterans, Quilts of Valor also presented a special "quilt of gratitude" to Evelyn Andrews, US Navy Dependent, for her support of veterans at Las Positas College.

This year's talk was an inspiring and enlightening display of the accomplishments and triumphs of women veterans in the modern-day. The event was attended by nearly a hundred individuals and served to provide scholarships to several student veterans in attendance of LPC.

- 1. Proof of discharge (DD214) or documentation of currently in the U.S. armed service?
- 2. An updated ED plan completed with an LPC counselor?
- 3. A GPA of 2.0 or higher?
- 4. Less than 100 units or credits completed?
- 5. Completion of LPC online orientation and Math/English self-assessments?

This event was free of charge for Veterans of the United States armed forces. Each patient received a dental screening, cleaning, an oral heath kit, and potential treatment of their most critical dental needs. The Health Center was kind enough to extend its generosity and grant services to the children of veterans who needed dental cleaning. Throughout this whole event, volunteers provided service dogs to ease the nerves of the veterans and or their children.

Comments received:

"I expected a routine visit and a packed event and was worried about finding out how bad I had been at taking care of my mouth. They provided a free check-up, an x-ray and a cleaning. It was great, the staff were friendly and accommodating. I didn't see any flaws but I think it'd be great if more people could participate." (J. Vidal)

"I was expecting to wait for an hour or so, have a dental student to take care of me so that they can have in-person practice and still have issues after the visit since it's all free. I did not just get a free cleaning, I was actually able to get a free deep cleaning since I have gum issues. It was fantastic. If they will do this every year or even twice, veterans won't need dental insurance anymore. It was way better than most community dental places. The Doctor was top class and they were hands on with me. They gave me a lot of tips and advices to help me



stay on top of my gum issues. I did not wait in line, there was no payment, the staff was helpful and kind, and most importantly my mouth feels amazing. I can't really top that off. All I can say is thank you!" (C. Carpio)


