I grew up in Stockton, CA, and at age 18 enlisted in the U.S. Army as an Airborne Infantryman assigned to the 82<sup>nd</sup> Airborne Division. I spent three years at Fort Bragg, NC, but was lucky in that I participated in jungle training in Panama, Arctic wilderness training in Alaska, desert training at the National Training Center, Fort Irwin, CA, and force on force training at the Joint Readiness Training Center at Fort Polk, LA. I conducted day and night airborne operations in support of major exercises, and I even landed in the trees on my last night jump in Division.

After being honorably discharged, I enrolled in and graduated from Las Positas College, and then went on to California State University, Sacramento, where I graduated with a Bachelor of Science in Criminal Justice and walked across the stage as part of the Criminal Justice Honors Society. After graduation, I re-enlisted in the U.S. Army National Guard, this time in the intelligence career track.
