4. SLO Webpage Edits: John Ruys stated that Madeline Wiest, Curriculum and SLO Specialist has already begun working on updating the SLO Website. We would like to bring the SLO Website in line with the current thinking and language of SLOs, PSLOs, and SAOs. The last time the website was updated with regards to our assessment policy was probably around 2009-2010. All of the new eLumen information, SLO Process, and reports from eLumen can stay the same. However, the PSLO section will need to be updated and SAO guidelines will need to be developed. Items will be rearranged, including moving the Timeline of what we have done to the archives page for accreditors to show what we have worked on previously. The resources page will be removed and the different items rearranged into other sections. The language regarding the three-year assessment cycle will be revised. This will need to be completed before the visit by the Accreditation team.

5. SLO Liaisons and Upcoming Workshops: John Ruys thanked the SLO Liaisons for their reports, which have been very helpful in writing the Accreditation Report. It has been approved to have SLO Liaisons in the spring, however we do not know how many. More release time have been requested for SLO Liaisons has been requested in the spring. It is unclear whether in Spring the SLO Liaisons will be required to submit a report, as they did this semester. Ann Hight stated from the reports it was clear that some departments could benefit from more assistance. Angelo Bummer said that he worked this semester with lots of new faculty, many of whom are the only full time faculty member in their department. John Ruys has put in a request to have a Flex Day activity to map the ISLOs. Ann Hight discussed how she noticed from program review that for some programs not all of the required courses mapped up to the PSLOs. While theoretically all required courses should map to a PSLO, this will not be mandated by the SLO Committee.

6. **ACCJC December Workshop: Making Student Learning Assessment Useful and Used:** John Ruys reported the VP Roanna Bennie has verified that there is funds to send three to five interested people to the December 5th in Burlingame from 8am to 3pm. As it is a Monday John Ruys will verify with Roanna Bennie if there will be funds available for substitute teachers, as many faculty members have classes during this time. John Ruys stated that he will go to the workshop. Ann Hight and Angelo Bummer stated that if they were able to have substitutes cover their classes that day, they would also attend. There was not a ISLO review at the Town Hall, as there was not enough time. Instead, John Ruys stated that he will send out an announcement that there will be a ISLO review on November 30th, which is a fifth Wednesday. There will be three more eLumen workshops this semester December 1st, 6th, 7th. Ann Hight stated that they should encourage faculty to bring their data to the workshops.
