<u>Background</u>: This MOU outlines the terms for a California Mathematics and Science Partnership Grant led by Hayward Unified School District (HUSD). Understanding that math success is critical to post-secondary success, HUSD has partnered with Chabot College to provide math content support for HUSD coaches and teachers. Chabot College will recruit at least one math teacher to share best practices in facilitating lesson design, unit planning, and assessments, use of assessment data to provide professional development and coaching support for differentiation of instruction and intervention, school visitations to observe mathematics instruction and coaching support, and participation on the HUSD CaMSP Leadership Team. Funds pay for faculty time to collaborate on infusing entrepreneurship curriculum across the disciplines. Funds also support the development of low-unit non-credit/credit entrepreneurship courses that can be offered at local adult schools, high schools and community-based service agencies.

HUSD shall pay an amount not to exceed \$20,850 for partnering with Chabot College for the period of July 1, 2015 through June 30, 2016 which includes up to \$850 in indirect costs to support the administration of this Memorandum of Understanding.

<u>Background</u>: The Murray Ranch property, approximately 401.36 acres, was purchased by Chabot-Las Positas Community College District (CLPCCD) in December of 2007 for \$4,100,000. The intent of the purchase was to mitigate the impact of development in building out Las Positas College (LPC) under the 2005 Facility Master Plan. Subsequent study and planning has established that 209 acres is needed for LPC mitigation. Within the 209 acres is located a 0.86 acre wetland consisting of several seasonal ponds. CLPCCD has been approached by ACTC interested in purchasing the mitigation rights to the 0.86 acre wetland as mitigation for their impact in widening of State Route 84 (SR84).
