B. Approval of October, 20, 2016 Minutes

Jim Meehan moves to approve the minutes of October 20, 2016 Mike McQuiston seconds the motion Motion approved, unanimously

C. Industry Update

• **Dave Spiller** – Nothing new with the budget; immigration issues are new; what is the police department's role in enforcing federal immigration; revising the immigration policy; complexities of immigration require evaluation on a case by case basis.

- **Mike McQuiston** ACLU, Freedom Cities, 9 point law enforcement policy and rules, https://peoplepower.org/freedom-cities.html#toc-9model
- Gena Steward- Hiring quite a few candidates due to retirement and injury
- **Jim Meehan** Implicit bias training in the DA's office

D. Faculty Report - Mark Tarte

- AS for transfer negative impact on traditional courses; need to standardize courses so that they are acceptable to CSUs; check enrollment statewide to see if this is a statewide problem; enrollment down this Spring to 70% (at 80% this Fall); students not taking as many classes; when the economy gets better the enrollment decreases
- Intro to AJ, Intro to Corrections and Criminal Law are all mandated classes. Ethics and Leadership are not required courses; Police Report Writing used to substitute for English 1A no longer; report writing is important, the discussion is on going
- Issues with marketing Marks used to have time to work with the academy, visit each area high school and do marketing. Mark's time has been cut (teaching 6 classes, 0.10 cut)
- Visit from accreditation body on May 3
- Adjuncts need training on eLumen, best day for training afternoons except Tuesdays or Friday 1 – 3 (Jim M); assess Spring/Fall of 2016 or Spring, 2017
- AJ certification shot down at the Chancellor's office yesterday because it is not a sequential course; Vice President, Roanna Bennie suggested doing 1 unit capstone during the academy (independent study)
- ROP Academy starting Fall of 2017, will be conducted Monday Friday at LPC, 8:00 to 10:00; pass with B or better for college credit; Ethics/leadership focus
- Update on facilities plan Building out LPC and Chabot, Measure A \$950 million, CTE building floated to include Public Safety, Welding, Auto, Viticulture and Horticulture; the district in now talking about Public Safety / Viticulture building; would like the Advisory Board to give feedback; 4 classrooms, instructor office space; conference room; larger classroom for CPR and scenario training
- Nan Ho District has pulled auto/welding out, 9000 sq. ft. building (\$9 \$10M project); the plan was adopted by the board
- Vicki Shipman How many hours does faculty need to do outreach? 12-24 hours per semester according to Mark. In Dublin 2 hours minimum per high school; applying for VTEA for next academic year for 30 hours/semester to do community outreach; Public Safety Majors Fair on May 3 and general Majors Fair on April 19; telepresence equipment not yet installed
- Motion to explore time for outreach/marketing (reassigned time vs release time)
 - o 1st David Spiller
 - o 2nd Mike Norton
 - o Motion approved, unanimously
- It is with unanimous consensus of the Public Safety Advisory Board that we urge the District that the Public Safety Building (Measure A) only include Public Safety and not viticulture

E. Next Steps

- Mark Tarte CTE, making changes in curriculum and acquiring new equipment takes so long, it's unworkable in the current community college system
- **Mike McQuiston** go out to the high schools to do marketing; explain that students don't have to go to work immediately, they can finish their degrees and comeback.
- **Jim Meehan** students may want to explore other areas of the criminal justice system
- Mark Tarte Public Safety Program Manager position at LPC will be posted next week (salary about \$110K); between faculty and Dean help to get students in clinical rotations; asks Advisory Board to think about classes LPC should offer in the AJ program to draw new students (email Mark); concerned that once he retires his position will not be filled for an undetermined amount of time.
- Nan Ho LPC is also hiring a new EMS coordinator
- Nan Ho recommends that LPC develops a forensics program
