5. "Through the Gate" report by RP Group - Rajinder Samra

- Rajinder shared a presentation pertaining to the summary of findings of the *Through the Gate* study conducted by the RP Group.
- The *Through the Gate* study was a district-wide study which included 94,883 students. Of those students only 23,943 students earned 12 transferable units, with 9,502 of them being LPC students.
- Other interesting findings: 33% of LPC students were missing their Math and English requirements, 56% had English but were missing Math and 11% had Math but were missing English.
- Discussion of potential interventions in response to the data: university affordability, pathway navigation, school-life balance, and support networking. Students find university affordability to be the most challenging, followed by school-life balance, pathway navigation and supportive networking.
