Good News:

- Courses identified for budgetary elimination will be open for enrollment next week
- □ The one-time sources identified to balance this year's budget can be used to solidify the District's reserve balance
- □ The district will receive some funding from Proposition 30



Prop 30 Impacts

Challenges:

- □ The district will receive some funding from Proposition 30!
 - Unclear if the funds will be "growth" or "restoration"
- Ongoing vs. One-Time imbalance continues

CEMC and DEMC will meet on November 16th to address the details of how the added funds from Proposition 30. Our budget cuts for this year included one-time reductions, so there will need to be additional discussions in regard to address those actions. The good news is that our initial projections show that we are under budget so far, allowing us flexibility to make decisions.

On Thursday there will be a more detailed, District wide discussion regarding the impacts and DBSG is already working on solutions!



Prop 30 Impacts

- Opportunities:
 - Measure I vote at 62% bodes well for a future initiative to secure bond funding
- Alameda County voted over 72% in support of Proposition 30
