Meeting Minutes

1. Call to Order at 8:34 am

2. Review and Approve Agenda

3. Review and Approve 1/15/21 Minutes

4. Budget Update

- The LPC budget shows the current is at about 50% which is in line with the present-day six-month mark
- The deficit and budget previously expected are off the table for now
- The May revise and April tax collection will provide a clearer outlook

5. CARES Allocation and Expenditure Update

- The CARES Act report is due to the State on 2/8/2021
- The report outlines all monies spent from March December 31, 2020
- The District covered LPC's initial CARES Act of their deadlines to spend all of their funding by December 31, 2021
- A new allocation of CARES Act money was received in early January
- The new allocation brings the funding available up to \$5.9 million
- The minimum spent on direct student aid 1.3 million
- A needs assessment went out to Classified, Faculty and Management
- The assessment will gauge how to best support those working from home
- VP Raichbart will follow-up with IT on software needs and how to get them out to those who need them
- Reimbursement of past purchases might be an option after the review and purchase of assessment needs
- The initial CARES Act balance is six hundred thousand dollars
- The money must be spent by May 19, 2021
- There are projects on campus that will utilize the funds to convert classes for on campus learning in social distanced format
- The committee discussed the deficits in Student Services support services for student
- Discussion on how to plan and prepare for two registration periods for summer and fall includes adding part-time counselors
- This consideration includes bringing back retirees
- Other points of discussion include: streamlining the onboarding process, retaining current students, locating potential web registration road blocks
- Other community colleges and four-year institutions have advisors who can assist students with everything but an ED plan

- The ability to answer phones remotely and assist student is something the CARES Act dollars can fund
- Options to assist students include a virtual welcome center, FAQs, and a one source of information/how to, limit manual process paperwork,
- A point of consideration is how to support new processes so they don't go unfinished
- The committee discussed specialize Counselors tied to a pathway
- The committee agreed overall changes were needed and additional funding is not a guarantee of success and retention
- Further discussion is necessary with all the pertinent parties in attendance
