Composition

- CEO, CIO, CTE Administrator, CTE Faculty from each college
- 2 CSSOs at-large, selected by CSSOs

Purview

- Decisions regarding allocation of funds that flow through the Regional Consortia
 - o CTE Enhancement Fund
 - o Strong Workforce Program funds
- Decision-making process
- Selection of Fiscal Agent
- Major policy direction

Decision-Making Process

- One vote per college
- Decisions made at meetings when possible, otherwise online

Staff

- BACCC Staff
- Center of Excellence in Labor Market Information
- Deputy Sector Navigators, K-14 Career
 Pathways and other Regional Technical
 Assistance Providers

CTE Consultation Council

Composition

- Cabinet level representative, CTE Administrator, CTE Faculty from each of 5 subregions, 2 CSSOs selected by CSSO's + alternates for each position if desired by region
- Representatives elected by colleges in the subregion, one vote per college
- All meetings open to guests

Purview

- Formulates recommendations to CTE Leadership Group on
 - o Allocation of funds that flow through the region
 - o Strong Workforce Program Fiscal Agent
 - Policy direction
 - o Organizational structure, decision-making processes
- Review of BACCC budget and expenditures
- Decision-making on
 - o Matters delegated to it by the CTE Leadership Group
 - Matters requiring decisions more quickly than is possible with the CTE Leadership Group
- Consultation to BACCC staff

Decision-Making Process

- One vote per lead representative (or alternate if lead representative not present)
- Decisions made at meetings when possible, otherwise online

Staff

- BACCC Staff
- Other Doing What Matters key talent as needed

Ad Hoc Committees

• Formed as needed to address issues and opportunities
