

Student-Focused Work

There will be a lot of opportunities for students to share their experience and input, from sometimes involvement to ongoing involvement. We are challenging everyone to bring to any initiative or Steering Committee a student, so that students are engaged and at the table as we collaboratively work to improve the student experience.

We are in the process of interviewing students to fill 5 paid student work positions to be involved in collaborating and moving the work forward.



CA Demonstration Project

- To implement an integrated, institution-wide approach to student success by creating structured educational experiences that support each student from point of entry to attainment of certificate or degree.
- 6 institutes (fall & spring) over the next three years.
- LPC was one of the 20 California Community Colleges accepted!
- LPC will send a team (President, VP, Deans and faculty) to the 6 institutes to receive guidance and support from other pathways coaches. It will also allow for time to plan for Guided Pathways work on our campus.



Leading from the Middle (LFM)

- LFM is a project-based, leadership development program, focused on professional development to build skills and strategies in middle community college leaders to advance lasting reform efforts on their campus
- This is our third-year as an LFM Cohort College where we have received the support to collaboratively work on Guided Pathways related initiatives with an LPC cross-discipline team
- This year's LFM Team chose a career development project. Participating Members include: Joel Gagnon, Erick Bell, Angella VenJohn, Francis DeNisco, Elizabeth David, and Kristy Woods
