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# What Is Dual Enrollment?

Dual Enrollment courses provide students with the opportunity to earn college credit while they are in middle and/or high school.

- Dual Enrollment - high school students to complete college level courses with their peers.
- Concurrent Enrollment - high school students attend courses on a college campus alongside college students.

# About AB 288

Assembly Bill 288 (2015) establishes the “College and Career Access Pathways Act” which

- Authorizes California Community College districts to enter into formal partnership agreements with local K-12 districts

“Dual Enrollment” is identified in AB 288 to define “special part-time” or “special full-time” students.

- high school or other eligible special admit students enrolling in community college credit courses.

AB 288 is an option, not a mandate.

# **College and Career Access Pathway (CCAP) Partnerships**

Expands dual enrollment for students who may not already be college bound or who are underrepresented in higher education.

Provides seamless pathways to community college for: CTE or transfer, improving high school graduation rates, or college and career readiness.


