If applicable, describe the legal requirement, mandate, or safety concern for purchase of this equipment, making specific reference to the legal requirement or regulation:

Current furniture is falling apart. Some of the chair handles pull off, which is a safety concern. Many of the student Veterans have physical disabilities, especially with back and legs, therefore sturdy and accommodating equipment is needed. As mentioned many of the student Veterans are rather large in size, and therefore the chairs identified must be larger than normal, but easy to move.

LPC is an inclusive learningcentered institution providing educational opportunities and support for completion of students' transfer, degree, basic skills, career-technical, and retraining goals.

- Accreditation: Establish regular and ongoing processes to implement best practices to meet ACCJC standards.
- Curriculum: Provide necessary institutional support for curriculum development and maintenance.
- * Tutoring Services: Expand tutoring services to meet demand and support student success in Basic Skills, CTE, and Transfer courses.
- Professional Development: Coordinate available resources to address current and future professional development needs of faculty, classified professionals, and administrators in support of educational master plan goals.

Specify how the equipment supports LPC's Mission Statement and Planning Priorities:

Multiple times, student Veterans, have commented that they really decided to choose Las Positas College for their education when they walked into the Veterans Resource Center. They saw a true Veterans Resource Center, not just a room with a few computers. They often state that seeing Veterans in the center and the observing the quality of the center gave them the first impression that Las Positas College is truly committed to student Veterans.

Las Positas College is a learning-centered institution providing educational opportunities and support for students' transfer, degree, basic skills, career-technical, and retraining goals. The VRC supports Veteran students in the same way. Many need the retraining, since they made the transition from military to college. Creating a welcoming environment that supports learning is the foundation of Las Positas College Veterans Resource Center. Having good condition equipment/furniture is one of the key elements in creating this welcoming environment.

The VRC furniture replacement request would also support the college planning priority around expanding tutoring services. The VRC houses, subject support specialists, especially in the area of math, who specifically work with Veteran students. As one of LPC planning priorities, expanding tutoring services to meet demand and support success in basic skills, CTE, and transfer courses occurs in the center and often times in the lounge because the study room cannot accommodate a large number of students at once.

SECTION 3: EDUCATIONAL ITEMS - PROGRAM REVIEW

Specify the educational programs this equipment supports:

The equipment requested supports all educational programs. Student Veterans at Las Positas study all majors, wish to achieve all levels of degrees and certificates and participate in all programs. The VRC supports mental health as well. Many studies and surveys have identified one of the biggest challenges Veterans face is the transition from military to college. Within this transition, Veteran students lose the comradery they had in the military. This bond between brothers and sisters who served, regardless of when and what branch served in, is very powerful. Many surveys have also shown schools who do not have VRCs or have no lounge area within their VRC, inhibit Veteran students from connecting with other Veterans on campus. They might sit alone in their cars between breaks, isolated and alone, which can lead to things such as severe depression, dropping out of school, and even suicide. In effect, a Veterans Resource Centers can save lives. Las Positas Veterans First program wants to create a welcoming and supportive environment that emphasizes to Veteran students that they deserve a quality center and quality furniture to study, relax, and take a break from class upon.

Included in the request are stackable chairs to accommodate larger meetings and workshops, which now are often attended by 20 or more students as the Center has grown. We lack storage space, so having additional stackable quality chairs is important can resolve this storage issue.

If this equipment is included in your Program Review, please include the exact wording. If equipment is not included, explain why:

The most recent Program Review for the Veterans Program, focuses a lot on the growth of the program and the need for new and larger space. Funding, staffing, and space continue to be main issues, as the program growth demands continue to outpace services, staffing, and space. Although the new current VRC is much larger than the first VRC, the increase of student Veterans and also the new services, such as counseling in the VRC, the VFP has out grown the current VRC. The current VRC space is no longer adequate for the various services and programs now offered. Between 2012-2017 the growth of Veterans has seen an increase much higher than the non-Veteran student increase rate: a 61% increase from 297 Veterans to 479.

Measure A was also passed with highlighting the Veterans attending Chabot and Las Positas College. One of the key areas of this bond was to improve support facilities and educational resources for Veterans. Having good condition, newer equipment would be a step towards meeting this promise to the voters. Since the new VRC has not been planned yet and most likely would not be built until more than five years from now, the replacement equipment is necessary to the program goals.

SECTION 4: TEACHING AND LEARNING

Describe in detail the impact this equipment will have on teaching:

Workshops and trainings that are directly taught in the VRC is impacted by the equipment/chairs in the VRC. As mentioned, many of the Veterans are large and often have back and leg service related injuries. Without safe, study, and adequate size of chairs, it makes it difficult for the student Veteran to be comfortable and an accommodating learning environment.

Describe in detail the impact this equipment will have on learning:

As mentioned above, if the equipment/chairs does not meet the student Veterans comfort and accessibility, especially with many who have physical service connected disabilities, they will have difficulties studying, attending workshops/presentations, and even relaxing and taking some anxieties and stress of making it better for them to learn when they go to class.

Each academic year, this equipment will impact: Many # of classes/sections 600 # of students

In the latest SAO for the Veterans First program, the VFP identified the on-going need to increase awareness of the Veterans First Program, so more Veterans, active duty, reservists/guard, and dependents/spouses of Veterans utilize the services and programs offered by the Veterans First Program, including the Veterans Resource Center. Therefore the equipment/furniture in the center, should be safe, welcoming, modern, and fit the welcoming environment that the VRC strives to provide.

In addition, a new goal of the VFP is to provide effective services that promote retention and student success by increasing the number of hours offered in the VRC for subject support, especially in math. In October, funds will be dedicated from the 2-year VRC grant offer more subject support specialists. Because of the increase of usage throughout the week because many Veterans prefer to get subject assistance in the VRC the center often sees the lounge area utilized for studying and subject support. Therefore the equipment furniture purchased will support Veterans and promote a successful learning environment.

What are the consequences related to learning outcomes if request is not funded?

The number one outcome if not funded: old equipment that is no longer safe will be discarded and there will be less equipment/chairs meet the needs of our Veterans, including those with service related disabilities. Fewer student Veterans will utilize the VRC, which could also impact number of new Veterans attending LPC as well as those who have been attending and may now leave because of the lack of commitment by the college for quality equipment our student Veterans need and deserve.

With the continued growth of LPC student Veterans population and increased traffic in the Veterans Resource Center, this equipment is expected to last for a 3-4 year life cycle. Old furniture if can be repaired can be donated to others to utilize it. Materials for the chairs are mostly wood

and cloth, with limited plastics. Purchasing top of the line means less often replacing broken equipment,

saving items from becoming landfill.
