	<ul> <li>Review of SEA Dashboard         <ul> <li>David Rodriguez presented an equity dashboard highlighting disproportionate impact groups, particularly focusing on first-generation students, African American and Latinx/HSI students, and explaining metrics like successful enrollment.</li> <li>Discussion of equity data and planning, focusing on six key areas: Access, persistence, transfer-level math and English, completion, transfer completion, and comprehensive student education plan</li> <li>Reviewed specific metrics showing disparities in student enrollment and persistence, particularly for first-generation and Hispanic students. The group clarified that while they can't proactively reach out to LGBTQ+ students due to legal restrictions, they can provide support in spaces and initiatives that students choose to engage with.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Breakout Groups         <ul> <li>All committee members and guests joined breakout rooms to brainstorm strategies and initiatives over the next three years, with the goal of submitting a comprehensive equity plan to the state.</li> <li>Participants discussed how to navigate the breakout rooms and shared insights from their conversations, emphasizing the importance of customizing support for diverse student experiences. The group decided to allow participants to move between rooms and concluded the session by collecting reflections and feedback from the breakout discussions, which highlighted the value of personal stories and collaboration in supporting students.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
