# There were many comments and suggestions captured, primarily about the Division Summary process.

- First time readers were not sure what to look for, what important themes?
- This was an easier process than last year, having the lists versus long narratives, easier to put into the Division template
- Less repetition because not so many categories, much easier to use, and straight forward
- Programs will still feel represented in the process of creating the summaries
- Really liked the prioritization process with the readers, more supportive to the Dean
- Being done at the end of the meeting, saved hours of work for the Deans
- Dean's meeting process helpful to do the collaborative problem solving
- More clarity needed on what the outcome of the Dean's meetings should be need to clarify this for the next time
- The prioritization language could be a bit challenging or ambiguous some clarifying language could be helpful in the next template
- The directions need to clarify to readers their role to identify some themes and start identifying priorities before the Dean's meetings
- Dean's should read all of the program reviews ahead of time;
- Need more instructions in the "tools for readers" about what to do in the meeting a good first question may be to ask the Dean is what is their process for making a prioritized list and how do they like to write it?
- Clarify the responsibility of outside readers
- Consider the load for readers
- How do we want to manage early readers versus late readers of the reviews?
