### Hawks Swim and Dive Teams End Season on a High Note



For the first time in seven years, the California Community College Athletic Association held the swimming and diving championships in Northern

California. DeAnza College was hosted this year's meet on May 3rd, 4th, and 5th. After sweeping the Coast Conference championship for the fourth year running, Las Positas College sent 17 athletes to the state meet seven female swimmers and one diver and nine male swimmers. The Hawks qualified for all five relays for both men and women. At the conclusion of the meet, both the women and men finished 19th overall. Women swimmers broke three relay records and one Coast Conference record. This is the third consecutive year that both the women and men finished in the top 10 in the state.
