### 2019 Highlights of Las Positas College Foundation

The LPC Foundation would like to thank all the individual contributors, college community, and community partners

for their support in helping Las Positas College students succeed. The LPC Foundation has helped address some of the most pressing needs of our students.

Some of the more notable projects included a foundation grant for the LPC athletics department Tri-Valley Basketball Camp. In August the Foundation hosted a reception for all new full-time faculty members which was followed by two new scholarships – the Nissen-Hansen P.E.O. and the XL Construction Scholarships. XL Construction Pledges \$20,000 in support as a Community Partner. In the last two months of the year the LPC Foundation supported the Veteran's Center 2.2 Walk and 5K run event to raise awareness of veteran suicide rates and raise funds for mental health support for veterans and their families. They established the Valerie Ball Memorial Scholarship Fund, and closed 2019 with a sponsorship for the 5-year anniversary celebration of the Engineering Technology Program, a partnership between Lawrence Livermore National Laboratory and LPC.

## **New Online Library Catalog System**

The LPC Library has gone live with a new library catalog system, OneSearch (also known as ALMA and PRIMO).



The State of California approved the community colleges to move to a new platform by allocating \$5 million dollars. 110 community college libraries including Las Positas and Chabot worked during the last year in implementing ALMA and Primo. In addition, students will have a chance to become familiar with the same interface for the library catalog that most community colleges and all CSUs currently use.
