The Market Food Pantry



Las Positas College resumed hosting The Market Food Pantry, in collaboration with the Alameda County Community Food Bank on Tuesday, May 29, 2020. Following social distancing guidelines, LPC's well-coordinated team of volunteers served more than 100 students and community members who remained in their cars during this distribution, making this Market distribution the largest one so far. The volunteers contributed in unloading food, pre-bagging items, and ensuring the patrons were served with respect. The team took all precautions, and even with their masks, were smiling. During the 2019-20 academic year, The Market served more than 1,000 student and community households. With the many, many changes that occurred due

to COVID-19, our community has been affected not only with food insecurities but reduction and/or loss of employment, physical illness, and even mental health issues. That is why LPC made a huge effort to coordinate and plan for this much-needed resource to continue, especially during this challenging time. Thank you to

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First of LPC CARES Emergency Grants are Awarded

On May 29 the Las Positas Financial Aid Office began disbursing emergency grant funds awarded by the CARES Act with \$1,032,000 disbursed to 1,376 students. Additionally, the college is running weekly disbursements to address students that were not awarded automatically. There is \$405,745 is still remaining. Students who are not eligible for the automatic awards will be able to apply for remaining funds through a simple application process currently being developed.

LPC Student a Second Time Pedrozzi Scholar

This year, the Pedrozzi Foundation awarded \$327,500 in scholarships to 86 local scholars. Since 2008, the Pedrozzi Foundation has awarded \$4.8 million to 1,312 Livermore students. Of the 2020 Pedrozzi Scholars, 23% will be the first in their family to attend col-



lege. These scholars will be attending community college, undergraduate, graduate, and trade schools.

This year LPC's Kaycee Bilke received her second Pedrozzi scholarship. Her first was awarded in 2017, which she used at Las Positas College and is now Graduating with two associate degrees and is transferring to CSU, East Bay to pursue a career in teaching.

Kaycee Bilke expressed her gratitude to the Pedrozzi Foundation, "I am so excited to be receiving the Pedrozzi scholar-ship again! After being awarded a community college scholarship in 2017, I became involved with the Pedrozzi Foundation and love everything it does for Pedrozzi Scholars, future applicants, and students in the community. I am honored to call myself a Pedrozzi Scholar for a second time. As I graduate from Las Positas with two associate degrees, I am heading to Cal State East Bay to pursue my degree in human development with an emphasis in early childhood development and a multiple subject teaching credential. Working while being a full-time student is difficult, but I learned so much about myself and what it takes to make my dreams come true. Having Pedrozzi support me again makes me feel that I am constantly supported by my community, and that everything I do is accounted for and recognized. 
