# Las Positas College One of Top 20 Community Colleges in the U.S.

Las Positas College has been named the 14th best community college in the country in a recent WalletHub report on the Top 20 Best Community Colleges in the United States.

WalletHub compared more than 650 community colleges within the American Association of Community Colleges to determine where students can receive the best education at the lowest price. Eighteen key indicators for cost and quality were reviewed, including cost of in-state tuition and fees to student-faculty ratio to graduation rate.

Also of note is that LPC ranked 14th in "Career Outcomes" which was determined by student-loan default rate, median salary after attending



college, and share of former students earning above the average earnings of a high school graduate. Further, LPC placed 5th out of 77 community colleges in California. Las Positas College will continue to put Students First by enriching and growing the community we serve by offering affordable, accessible and equitable programs and courses.

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#### **LPC Remembers 9.11**





On September 11, 2020, the Las Positas College Veterans First Program held a 9-11 remembrance with a live virtual program featuring keynote speaker, Lieutenant Colonel Robert J. Darling, USMC Veteran.

Lt. Col. Darling shared his account of that fateful Tuesday morning, September 11, 2001 where he stood shoulder-to-shoulder with America's highest leaders including Vice President Dick Cheney and Secretary of State Condoleezza Rice in a bunker underneath the White House as they made unprecedented decisions on behalf of all Americans. He says, "Leadership and crisis management were the difference between hope and despair."

Students, faculty, staff, and community members were invited to this very special presentation to honor the fallen.


## How LPC Can Participate in the Undocumented Student Action Week

Las Positas College will be participating once again in the California Community Colleges Undocumented Student Action Week from October 19 - 23.

Beginning in 2017, the California Community College Chancellor's Office encouraged and supported all 115 California Community Colleges to hold an Undocumented Student Week of Action.

At its September, 2018 meeting, the California Community Colleges Board of Governors approved a resolution indicating that the California Community Colleges are committed to providing an open and welcome environment for all students, regardless of ethnicity, religion, national origin, immigration status, age, gender, medical condition or socioeconomic status. The Undocumented Student Week of Action encourages community colleges to plan events that support undocumented students in their pursuit of higher education and that advocates to Congress a pathway to citizenship for the current Dreamers, DACA, and Undocumented students.

The kick-off event began Wednesday, October 14, 2020 with a webinar from the Chancellor's Office System. Webinars will be facilitated in the following areas: Financial Aid Update, Policy Update, Student Track, Counseling Faculty Track, Administrators Track, Faculty Track, and UndocuLiason and Classified Staff Track. #### **Work-Based Learning Courses**







Students can now earn college credits for working by enrolling into a work-based learning course. If the student holds a job, internship, or steady volunteer work, they can now earn college credit by enrolling in one of two WRKX class. Depending on the hours a student works, they can earn six or eight units each semester as long as the student works 75 paid hours or 60 unpaid hours per unit. #### President's Speaker Series Presents Tyrone C. Howard, Ph.D.



Dr. Tyrone C. Howard was the featured speaker for October's President's Speaker Series, a partnership between LPC's President's Office and the LPC Foundation.

Dr. Howard is professor in the Graduate School of Education and Information Studies at UCLA. He is also the inaugural director of the new UCLA Pritzker Center for Strengthening Children and Families, a campus-wide consortium examining academic, mental health, and social emotional experiences and challenges for California's most vulnerable youth populations. Dr. Howard is the former Associate Dean for Equity, Diversity & Inclusion. His research examines equity, culture, race, teaching and learning. He has published over 75 peer-reviewed journal articles, book chapters, and technical reports as well as several bestselling books, including Why Race and Culture Matter in Schools: Closing the Achievement Gap in America's Classrooms and Black Male(d): Peril and Promise in the Education of African American Males. His most recent book, All Students Must Thrive, focuses on equity, race, trauma, and learning. It has become a must read for all educators. Dr. Howard is considered one of the premiere experts on educational equity and access in the country.

The Lawrence Livermore National Laboratory (LLNL) and Las Positas College Science and Engineering Seminar series provides LLNL scientists and engineers a forum to share basic and applied research with LPC students and faculty

and the Tri-Valley community. The presentations typically focus on how teams of scientists work together to solve problems from theory to practice.

LPC will virtually host its first fall 2020 event on Tuesday, October 13, 2020 via Zoom at 7:00 PM. Please join us in the presentation of "Environmental Radiochemistry: Where Radio Chemistry meets Environmental Science" by Dr. Mavik Zavarin.

Dr. Mavrik Zavarin received his B.S. in chemistry and Ph.D. in Soil Chemistry from the University of California, Berkeley. He has spent much of his career at LLNL studying actinide environmental chemistry. He is currently the director of the Glenn T. Seaborg Institute, manages an active research group of postdocs and graduate students, and has published over 50 papers. In addition, Dr. Zavarin teaches introductory Chemistry at Las Positas College on occasion. Joining for the question/answer session: Enrica Balboni, staff scientist, environmental radiochemistry and nuclear forensics, Gauthier Deblonde, staff scientist, actinide chemistry.





On Wednesday September 16, 2020 the Committee on Accreditation of Educational Programs for the Emergency Medical Services Professions (CoAEMSP) found Las Positas College's annual report to be satisfactory in all metrics of student success. The current threshold of 70% was exceeded in all categories which included: NREMT/State Written Exam: 90.5 %, Retention: 92%, and Positive Job Placement: 95.7%.
