LPC Breaks Ground on New Buildings

The Tri-Valley and College Community were invited to attend a groundbreaking ceremony celebrating construction of the three new buildings on campus that include the Academic Support & Office Building, Public Safety Complex/ Advance Manufacturing & Transportation, and the Agriculture Science: Horticulture building.

The event was attended by numerous prominent members of the Tri-Valley community, Chabot - Las Positas Community College Board of Trustees and District Office, members of Chabot College, and LPC administrators, faculty, staff, and students.

Funding for these projects was made possible on June 7, 2016 when Alameda County voters passed Measure A, the \$950 million bond for Chabot and Las Positas Colleges. The Bond allows the Colleges to upgrade aging classrooms and technology/science labs for career education to prepare students, veterans and workers for good jobs and university transfer, remove asbestos/retrofit buildings for earthquake safety, acquire, construct and repair sites/facilities/equipment, and improve campus safety/security.

Veterans First Program is the Recipient of Centers of Excellence for Veteran Student Success Grant

On August 18, 2021 Todd Steffan, LPC's Veterans First Supervisor received the news that LPC's Veterans First Program was the recipient of the Centers of Excellence for Veteran Student Success Grant (CEVSS) in the amount of \$445,411 for three years. The CEVSS program encourages model programs to support veteran student success in postsecondary education by coordinating services to address the academic, financial, physical, and social needs of veteran students.

Todd Steffan says, "This grant is a game changer. It will take the Las Positas College Veterans First Program to the next level. It could not have come to us at a more critical time. This grant will help us meet the new requirements from the Isaksen Roe and Stafford Veterans Health Care and Benefits Improvement Act, such as the mandatory personalized Veterans shopping sheet. This grant will also help us expand outreach, provide case management, implement an early alert system, increase equity and diversity, and help support the development and implementation of innovative program/services to our veterans, especially in these very challenging times."

Congratulations to the Veterans First Program and everyone that assisted in helping secure this grant for the College.

9.11 Remembrance

On September 09, Las Positas Veterans First Program welcomed Dr. Nicole B. Simpson, a 9.11 World Trade Center survivor as the keynote speaker for the annual 9.11 remembrance event at LPC.

It has been 20 years since that tragic day. The event started with the ROTC Air Force Honor Guard presenting colors with the singing of the National Anthem by LPC student Alejandra Sermeno Quezada, followed by a moment of silence and welcome by LPC President Dyrell Foster. Dr. Nicole B. Simpson, a 9/11 World Trade Center survivor, was working on the 73rd floor of Tower II on September 11, 2001. Dr. Simpson shared her personal experience from 9.11 as well as advice about resilience and healing. Her presentation also provided inspirational hope on how to walk the road of recovery when faced with a catastrophic event. She is a motivational speaker, author, and certified financial planner who has been on various shows such as CNN Live, BBC World News, and Money Matters. The 9.11 Remembrance was sponsored by the Las Positas College President's Office, Veterans First Program, and Student Veterans Organization. LPC Students Receive AGS State Scholarships

The 95th Annual Spring 2021 Alpha Gamma Sigma (AGS) Honor Society State Convention was held virtually this year. Three Las Positas College AGS students were nominated for state AGS scholarships this spring. All three students were subsequently selected at the AGS State Convention and recognized for their outstanding efforts.



Megan Mehta received the AGS Randy Taylor Service scholarship, which is given to the top service award recipient in the state. She is the second LPC student to receive this scholarship which is named after former LPC AGS Advisor Randy Taylor. Megan was the AGS Secretary in 2020-2021. She was also a member of the LPC Honors Transfer Program, the Math Club, Mu Alpha Theta Mathematics Honor Society, the Girls Who Code, LPC College Loop Club, and the Computer Science Club. She received the 2021 10th annual Innovation Tri-Valley Dreammakers and Risktakers Award for her podcast *Think Scope*, 2nd place for best STEM Poster at the 2021 Honors Transfer Council of California Research Conference, and the Transplant Recipients International Organization Scholarship. Megan was a member of LPC Middle College and is transferring to U.C. Berkeley this fall to double major in Computer Science and Environmental Economic & Policy. After earning a BS degree, she plans to obtain an MBA.

Sarah Burton received the AGS Robert Mantovani Academic, Service, and Leadership scholarship which recognizes a combination of outstanding achievement in academic, service, and leadership. Sarah was the AGS President in 2020-2021. She was also a member of the LPC Biology Club, the Beta Beta Beta National Biology Honor Society, the Math Club, and the Mu Alpha Theta Mathematics Honor Society. She also received the AGS Achievement scholarship, the AGS Activism and Spirit scholarship, the AGS Executive Officers' Leadership Award, and the Stanford Health Care Valley Care Auxiliary scholarship. Hawks Ranked No. 2 in State Soccer Poll

California Community College Sports Information Association (CCCSIA) released its first state women's soccer poll for the 2021 season and listed the LPC Hawks in the No. 2 spot in the rankings.

Las Positas received one first-place vote and totaled 170 points, just seven points behind No. 1 Ventura College (3-0).

The Hawks, who are undefeated over their first four games, have yet to allow a goal, and have outscored their opponents by a 24-0 margin. LPC is coming off of an 11-0 rout over College of the Redwoods on September 8.

Under the direction of head coach Andy Cumbo, LPC's women's soccer team appears to be well on their way to defending their undefeated 2019 Coast Conference North Division championship. Conference play begins on September 28 when Las Positas travels to Cañada College.

The Las Positas women's team was back in action on Friday, September 10 and traveled to Diablo Valley College to a non-conference game.
