In addition to the informational sessions and tours, the day featured demonstrations by students and faculty members, live music and food trucks, making it a fun and enjoyable experience for all.




LPC's 3rd Annual Literary Arts Festival

Las Positas College will host its 3rd annual Literary Arts Festival on Saturday, May 13th. The event will begin at the Mertes Center for the Arts from 10 a.m. - 6:30 p.m. and will showcase a variety of literary works, including poetry, fiction, nonfiction and more.

This year's festival will feature Tommy Orange, American Book Award winner and author of "*There There*." Tommy Orange is an American novelist and writer from Oakland, California. Orange's, "*There There*" is a national bestseller that won the PEN/Hemingway Award, the National Book Critics Circle John Leonard Prize, the Center for Fiction First Novel Prize, and the American Book Award. It was also shortlisted for the Andrew Carnegie Medal for Excellence in Fiction, the Dayton Literary Peace Prize, and was a Pulitzer Prize finalist. It appeared on countless "Best Books of the Year" lists, including The New York Times, The Washington Post, NPR, Time, O: The Oprah Magazine, GQ, and Entertainment Weekly. Orange is an enrolled member of the Cheyenne and Arapaho Tribes of Oklahoma. He earned a Masters in Fine Arts from the Institute of American Indian Arts. Orange will sit down for a fireside chat with LPC English Professor and author of "*The Spitboy Rule*", Michelle Cruz Gonzales, before hosting a writing workshop later in the afternoon.

Additionally, NY Times #1 bestselling author Bruce Henderson will be joined by LPC English Professor Dr. Jim Ott for a discussion, followed by LPC student Veterans sharing their thoughts on writing about their military experiences.

Attendees can also enjoy panels, workshops, book signings, food trucks, music and activities for children from the local libraries. This event is open to the public, and admission is free. Registration is encouraged.

On March 23, The Veterans First Program held the 11th annual Honoring Women Veterans program. The theme of the program was "Her Story," to bring the stories of the women veterans to the public.

The ceremony not only recognized women veterans for their service to our country but honored three amazing Las Positas College students and Armed Services Veterans with scholarships. Arica Steedley, US Army Veteran was awarded \$500 from the Blue Star Moms, Amber Maynard, US Coast Guard Veteran was awarded \$500 from the Daughters of the American Revolution, and Maria Stephanie Caballero, US Navy Veteran was awarded \$5,000 from the Valley Veterans Foundation. TUITION-FREE AT LPC



In March, Las Positas College launched its LPC Tuition-Free program that offers free college tuition to eligible students. The LPC Tuition-Free program is part of a statewide initiative known as the California College Promise Program which aims to make higher education accessible and affordable for all Californians. To qualify for the new LPC Tuition-Free program,

students must be first-time, full-time students (12+ units per semester) and complete either the FASFA or California Dream Act application. The program covers the cost of tuition and fees, but students are still responsible for covering the cost of books, transportation, and other expenses.

The new LPC Tuition-Free program will be featured on the cover of the printed Summer/Fall Schedule. It will also be the main focus of the new CLPCCD Fall campaign which will include digital ads, social marketing, print ads and display ads in malls and on public buses. The LPC Tuition-Free program at Las Positas College is an excellent opportunity for eligible students who are looking to pursue higher education without the burden of financial stress.

LPC Participates at State Business Conference Competitions

LPC finished in second place at the March 31-April 2 California Phi Beta Lambda State Business Leadership Conference in San Diego, where LPC Business Club students competed with students from two- and four-year colleges and universities.

Twenty-three LPC students won 46 awards for individual and group competitions that were both knowledge and performance based. Some were timed case studies in which a team was required to analyze an issue, find a solution, and present it to a panel of judges. Students studied and practiced extensively to prepare for the competitions. The 39 competitive events included Global Analysis & Decision Making, Hospitality Case Study, and Future Business Executive. Accompanied by Business Studies Professor and Club Advisor Mary Lauffer, 31 LPC students attended the conference, which featured business speakers and workshops in addition to the competitions.
