These include the three-time recipient of the Chancellor's Award, the Outstanding Full-Time Faculty Award and the three-time recipient of the Outstanding Teaching Award.

Dr. Ho holds a doctorate of organizational change and leadership from the University of Southern California. She holds a master's and bachelor's degree of biological science from Stanford University. Her contributions extend beyond the classroom, having served in various leadership positions, such as department coordinator, committee chair, grievance officer for the Faculty Association, president of the Administrators' Association and faculty advisor to student clubs and the Beta Beta Beta Honor Society.
